داروخانه ها خالی از ماسک دولتی

نایب رئیس انجمن داروسازان استان تهران، گفت: بعد از نقل قول هایی که در روزهای گذشته پیرامون توزیع ماسک با قیمت مصوب دولتی در داروخانه ها مطرح شد، وزارت صمت فعلا اقدامی نکرده است. بهمن صورت به تشریح وضعیت توزیع ماسک با قیمت مصوب در داروخانه ها پرداخت و افزود: بعد از اینکه در روزهای گذشته صحبت های زیادی در ارتباط با عرضه ماسک با قیمت مصوب دولتی در داروخانه ها مطرح شد، وزارت صمت فعلا ماسک توزیع نکرده و پاسخگو نیست. وی با اعلام اینکه قرار شد قیمت ماسک سه لایه تولید داخل در کارخانه ۱۰۰۰ تومان باشد، گفت: قرار بود قیمت این ماسک برای شرکت های بخش ۱۱۵۰ و برای مصرف کننده ۱۳۰۰ باشد که فعلا خبری نیست. صورت با عنوان این مطلب که ماسک به نرخ ۲۰۰۰ تا ۲۲۰۰ تومان در کارخانه ها موجود است، ادامه داد: البته قیمت ماسک های سه لایه، کارخانه به کارخانه فرق می کند. نایب رئیس انجمن داروسازان استان تهران، در خصوص ماسک های سه لایه که با قیمت ۶۰۰۰ تومان عرضه می شود، گفت: این ماسک ها با ارز نیمایی وارد شده و قیمت آنها گران تر است. وی با انتقاد از عدم توجه وزارت صمت به مشکلات داروخانه ها در مواجهه با مردم برای خرید ماسک با قیمت مصوب دولتی، افزود: تولید کنندگان بدون دادن فاکتور، ماسک را با قیمت های متفاوت و هر تعداد که درخواست داشته باشیم، می دهند.

پروتکل بهداشتی کنکور ابلاغ شد

معاون مرکز سلامت محیط و کار وزارت بهداشت، در مان و آموزش پزشکی از ابلاغ پروتکل بهداشتی کنکور خبر داد و جزئیات آن را اعلام کرد.



محسن فرهادی افزود: پروتکل های بهداشتی برگزاری کنکور طی جلساتی که با مسئولان سازمان سنجش آموزش کشور و مرکز سنجش آموزش پزشکی وزارت بهداشت برگزار شد، تدوین و ابلاغ شده است. اساس این پروتکل ها رعایت یکسری مسائل ساده بهداشتی است که کار سخت و پیچیده ای نیست اما رعایت آنها نیازمند دقت و نظارت کافی است. وی ادامه داد: از جمله اصول پروتکل بهداشتی کنکور این است که در مرحله اول همه داوطلبان باید وضعیت سلامت خود را اعلام کنند. برای افرادی که بطور قطع بیمار هستند تمهیداتی پیش بینی شده به طوری که یا در داخل بر خی بیمارستانها امتحان می دهند یا اینکه در اتاق یا فضای مجزا در کنار پنجره و دور از سایر داوطلبان امتحان می دهند. معاون مرکز سلامت محیط و کار وزارت بهداشت گفت: زدن ماسک برای همه

نکته بسیار مهم دیگر این است که در همه حوزه های برگزاری آزمون باید ضد عفونی و گندزدایی سطوح قبل از آزمون انجام شود. بعد از برگزاری آزمون همه جاهای حوزه امتحانی اعم از صندلی، دسته های صندلی، میزها، کف سالن و بقیه جاها باید ضد عفونی شود.

ویتامینی برای کاهش اضطراب

Iran, Turkey stress on need to expand economic exchanges

Iranian Parliament Speaker Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf and his Turkish counterpart Mustafa Sentop held a phone conversation, stressing on the need to expand mutual relations and cooperation.

During the phone talks, Mustafa Sentop congratulated the speaker of Iran's parliament on Eid al-Adha, saying, "With the blessing of this great Eid, we will witness the eradication of the coronavirus from all over the world."

Pointing to the need to expand all-out relations between Iran and Turkey, he said, "Neighborliness, cultural affinity and humanitarian relations between the peoples necessitate promoting ties to higher levels, as the presidents of the two countries are in close contact in this regard."

Referring to the US cruel sanctions, Mustafa Sentop said that the US has expanded the scope of its oppressive sanctions against some countries, especially the Islamic Republic of Iran. Turkey opposes these sanctions and it has stated this in all international forums.

Ghalibaf, for his part, said that Iran's parliament is determined to set up a friendship group with Turkey at the earliest and promote mutual cooperation.

Stressing on the importance of developing economic exchanges between Iran and Turkey, he noted, "The coronavirus has caused a decline in economic exchanges between the two countries, but it is possible to further promote trade relations by upholding health protocols". Pointing to the capabilities of medical staff in Iran, Ghalibaf added, "Despite the inhumane US sanctions, we have successfully operationalized medical and health programs and gained valuable experience in this field."

Welcoming the strengthening of all-out cooperation with Turkey, he hoped that bilateral relations would enhance in international and regional forums, and in particular, cooperation between the two countries in the form of the Astana Summit would continue.

Despite US sanctions: Iran's petchem production capacity to increase by 4mm tons

With the implementation of three petrochemical projects, Iran's petrochemical production capacity will increase by 4 million tons in spite of tough US sanctions imposed against the country.

These three petrochemical projects would be put into operation in the country on Thu. Aug. 6, in the presence of Iranian President Hassan Rouhani, said Chief Executive of National Petrochemical Company (NPC) Behzad Mohammadi on Tue in an interview with IRNA.

He pointed to the inauguration of three giant petrochemical projects and added, "these petrochemical projects include Kaveh Petrochemical Company, Middle East Kimia Pars Petrochemical Company and catalyst project of Lorestan Petrochemical Company which would increase petrochemical production capacity up to four million tons." The aforementioned petrochemical projects, costing \$1.57 billion at large, would add more than four million tons to the production capacity of petrochemical in the country, Mohammadi reiterated.

A number of 27 petrochemical projects have been defined at the second stage, total of which would become operational by 2021, he said, adding, "of total 27 projects, 17 of which would be put into operation before the termination of the current year (to end March 20, 2021), based on which, petrochemical production capacity would increase from current 66 million tons to 90 million tons at large."

Implementation of these 27 petrochemical projects by 2021 with the production capacity of 100 million tons would yield \$25 billion worth of foreign currency for the country, NPC chief stressed.

Bad Debts Decline %11

The number of bad checks fell by %11.7 in the calendar month ending June 20, compared to a month earlier, the Central Bank of Iran reported.



Data published on the CBI website show that 881,000 checks were not processed by banks in the mentioned month.

In value terms, bad checks were worth 186 trillion rials (\$808.6 million), increasing 11.2% compared to the earlier month.

Bad checks accounted for 11.2% and 12% of all drawn checks in the month in terms of volume and value, respectively. The percentages were higher when compared with the same month last year when checks with 9.4% in volume and 11.1% in value were returned.

In the reviewed period, about 269,000 checks worth 87 trillion rials (\$378m) bounced in Tehran Province, accounting for 10.6% and 11% in volume and value of bad debt.

In terms of numbers, Kohgiluyeh-Boyerahmad Province topped the list with the highest ratio of bad checks to transacted checks at 18.1%.

Provinces with the lowest ratio were Gilan at %7.7, Alborz %9.5 and Mazandaran %10.



Chaharmahal-Bakhtiari Province was next at 15% and Kurdistan third with 14.6%.

Provinces with the lowest ratio were Gilan at 7.7%, Alborz 9.5% and Mazandaran 10%.

Insufficient funds in the accounts of issuers were the main reason why the checks were rejected. More than 858,000 checks worth 173 trillion rials bounced because of not sufficient funds (NSFs).

Drawn Checks More than 7.9 million checks worth 1,544 trillion rials (\$6.7b) were issued in the month. The number of drawn checks went down 1.2% while value increased 13.7%, compared to the earlier month.

Out of all checks drawn in

the month, 2.5 million valued at 789 trillion rials (\$3.58b) were issued in Tehran Province, making it the province with the highest volume and value of drawn checks, accounting for 32.2% and 51.1% of all drawn checks, respectively. Isfahan Province was second both in volume and value, representing 10.4% of all drawn checks and 6.4% of the value.

About 7 million checks were cleared by banks in the month, indicating 0.4% increase in volume compared to a month earlier. Value of cleared checks was 1,358 trillion rials (\$6.17b), showing 14.1% monthly rise. During the month 2.3 million checks valued at 702 trillion rials (\$3.19b) were cashed in Tehran Province.

Cashier Checks

Around 683,000 cashier checks worth 1,168 trillion rials were cleared by the banks indicating 3.4% and 6.6% decline, respectively in volume and value.

More than 208,000 checks worth 628 trillion rials were cashed in Tehran.

A cashier's check is a check guaranteed by a bank, drawn on the bank's own funds and signed by a cashier. Cashier's checks are treated as guaranteed funds because the bank, rather than the purchaser, is responsible for paying the amount.

The CBI report covered only interbank checks processed by Chekavak, a CBI-affiliated electronic check processing system, and did not include checks that circulate within branches of a single bank.

Cigarette Output Down 27.9%, Smuggling Up 97.5%

A total of 6.07 billion cigarettes were produced in the first two months of the current Iranian year (March 20-May 20), indicating a 27.9% decline compared with the year before.

The Ministry of Industries, Mining and Trade estimates that 4.76 billion cigarettes were smuggled into Iran, registering a year-on-year surge of 97.51% given the 10.83 billion cigarettes smoked in the country during the two-month period, ISNA reported.

It is worth noting that cigarette import to Iran has been banned for a long time now.

In early July, Mohammad Reza Tajdar, the head of Tobacco Products Importers and Exporters

Association, said, "Due to complications associated with the provision of foreign currency from the so-called secondary FX market, known by its Persian name Nima, to import cigarette raw materials, seven cigarette and tobacco factories have suspended their operations and the remaining enterprises are working at 50% of their capacity; only one is operating at 70% of its capacity."

The Central Bank of Iran has recently changed the import category of raw materials of cigarette from Group II to Group III, suggesting that importers have to meet their forex requirements from exporters who are not required to offer their forex earnings on the secondary FX market rather than those who have to offer their earnings on the market like exporters of non-oil products (petrochemicals, steel and minerals).

Noting that Iran's tobacco industry, which employs 50,000 people, needs imported raw materials worth €300 million annually to stay afloat, Tajdar said, "Imports account for 70% of the raw materials needed by the industry. Unless CBI allows provision of forex from the export earnings traded through Nima, the share of contraband cigarettes from the market is bound to increase from 20-50%. Cigarette is not a necessity good, no question about that, but it is consumed by 12 million people in the country, which makes it an essential item."

A total of 54.8 billion cigarettes were produced in the last fiscal year (March 2019-20), indicating a 13.7% growth compared with the year before.

Cigarette exports saw a 2.7% increase to stand at 154 million while the ban on imports remained in effect.

Iran's exports to Greece fell by %70

"During the first quarter of the current year, Iran's exports to Greece reached to \$ 1.7 million which has decreased by nearly 70%," an official said. The Secretary-General and member of the board of directors of Iran-Greece Joint Chamber of Commerce Majid Movafiq Qadiri said to ILNA news agency that Iran's exports to Greece in the first quarter of 2019 were about \$ 5.3 million; adding "Of course, this amount is very different compared to the first quarter

this period we exported more than \$ 670 million to Greece." He confirmed that in the first quarter of 2020, Iran's imports from Greece worth \$ 2.7 million, a decrease of 60% compared to a similar period last year. "The decline in trade relations between the two countries dates back to before of the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak on international trade and shows that sanctions have affected Iran's exports more than imports," he added.

Iran's export of products downs in 4 months due to outbreak

Head of Trade Promotion Organization of Iran (TPOI) said that country's export volume of products declined in the first four months of the current year (from March 21 to July 22) due to the coronavirus global pandemic.

Speaking in an interview with FNA on Tue., Hamid Zadboumsaid, "like other countries, Iran's export of products decreased in this period due to the outbreak significantly."

Turning to the main reasons behind considerable decline of country's exports volume in the first four months of the current year, he said, "Iran's exports were severely affected by the coronavirus pandemic in the first two months of the current year (from March 21 to May 22), so that country could not export its products following the closure of borders."

Currently, two land borders, including Iran's land border with neighboring Turkmenistan, are still closed, he said, adding, "accordingly, reduction of export was completely predictable."

Elsewhere in his remarks, the deputy minister of industry put the value of the country's gas export to Turkey in the first three months of the last year at about \$ 2 billion and added, "this year, no gas was exported to neighboring Turkey this year, so that this issue had an impact on reducing Iran's exports." Exports of all countries in the world were severely affected by the coronavirus global pandemic, he said, adding, "even, export of a country like China decreased significantly due to the outbreak."

Borders have been reopened in recent months one after another but currently, two of 31 land borders are still closed, he added.

Iran's trade balance in the first four months of the current year (from March 21 to Jul 22) turned -\$ 2.2 billion due to the outbreak. Also, statistics show that country's non-oil exports has decreased 41 percent as compared to the last year's corresponding period.

China to Retaliate If US Forces Out Chinese Journalists

China will take retaliatory measures if all Chinese journalists based in the United States are forced to leave the country, including targeting US journalists in Hong Kong, Global Times Editor in Chief Hu Xijin said on Tuesday.

"Given that the US side hasn't renewed visa of Chinese journalists, Chinese side has prepared for the worst scenario that all Chinese journalists have to leave the US." Hu said on Twitter. "If that's the case, Chinese side will retaliate, including targeting US journalists based in HK", Reuters reported.

The Global Times newspaper is published by the People's Daily, the official newspaper of China's ruling Communist Party. The United States limited visas for Chinese journalists in the country to 90 days, with an option for extension, effective May 11. It was not immediately clear how many Chinese journalists have been affected or how many may be required to leave if their visas are not extended.

The two countries have already exchanged several tit-for-tat actions involving journalists in recent months, with the US designating multiple Chinese state or Communist Party-backed media as foreign embassies.

China has also expelled US journalists for three US newspapers - New York Times, Wall Street Journal and the Washington Post - this year and has threatened to match any further actions by the US against Chinese journalists.

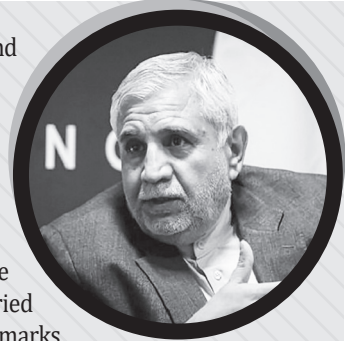
Intl. community must react to US human right violation

Calling the US sanctions amid coronavirus crisis and its harassment on Iran's airliner in violation of human rights, Mohsen Pak Ayeen urged the international community to force the US to fulfil its human rights obligation.

A Member of the Islamic World Peace Forum made some remark on the anniversary of "Islamic Human Rights and Human Dignity Day", saying that respecting human dignity and human rights have been emphasized many times in the Qur'an, therefore, the Islamic Republic of Iran considers itself obliged to respect human rights.

Referring to Iran's health assistance to countries involved in combat against coronavirus, he stressed that the international community is committed to expanding international cooperation in case of happening natural disasters, including earthquakes, floods, and disease, and the importance of this cooperation has become doubled during the outbreak. "At a time when all international institutions are emphasizing the need to lift sanctions on the countries involved in coronavirus, unfortunately, we are witnessing the United States' act of health terrorism and violation of human rights by imposing and intensifying sanctions against independent countries like Iran" he added. He continued to refer to the intimidating US fighter jet action against the Mahan airliner over the Syrian sky and added "the harassment was not only an example of interference in the internal

affairs of an independent country and contrary to international standards but also a clear violation of human rights, as it endangers the lives of innocent people. From the perspective of Islamic human rights, such inhumane acts are certainly condemned, and justice dictates that the perpetrators be tried and punished." Elsewhere in his remarks, he called on all countries to unite and confront the anti-human policies of the United States and force Washington to fulfill its human rights duties.



President Rouhani says enemy trying to show Iran Gov't as ineffective

President Hassan Rouhani said the main part of the enemy's war on Tehran is attempting to instill that the Iranian government is ineffective, distort its capabilities, and deny its successes in order to disappoint people and weaken resistance to the US economic war.



Referring to Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei about the enemies short-term and long-term goals to stop

economic progress of Iran, President Rouhani said that the enemy is using sanctions and distortion of realities to pursue its goals of stopping economic progress of Iran, drawing a black picture of its achievements, and instilling disappointment. Speaking in the 157th meeting of the government's economic coordination board, Rouhani said that the enemy is feeling the defeat more than anyone else, spreading rumors and misinformation, instilling that the government is ineffective,

the officials need to get united to effectively fight against the psychological war, sanctions and distortions



and, most importantly, creating a rift between the officials of the country are actually in line with the goals of the enemy. He said that the officials need to get united to effectively fight against the psychological war, sanctions and distortions, and added that the honorable people of Iran have always supported the Islamic System and definitely all the achievements and successes have ridden on that support, wisdom, and resistance. He added that Iran has

been under unprecedented pressures over the past two years, but, has managed to reduce dependence on oil income; the government has also managed to provide basic needs of the country and prevent unemployment from getting worse. President Rouhani said that inaugurating big projects is like a thorn in the eye of the enemy and that they are angry with the people of Iran and try to deny facts like agricultural self-sufficiency and increase in production in different fields.

Referring to the heavy damages inflicted by the coronavirus on the economy of the world, even world powers, President Rouhani said, according to other countries, the Iranian government has to fight wars of the sanctions and coronavirus at the same time, adding that Iran has had eye-catching successes in economy and campaign against coronavirus. Comparing the decrease in GDPs of Europe (10%) and the US (30%), Iran has shown better resilience, he said.

Pakistan PM says efforts underway for Iran-Saudi mediation

Prime Minister of Pakistan says efforts are underway for mediation between Iran and Saudi Arabia though making slow progress.

Imran Khan said in an interview with Al Jazeera: "Our mediation between Iran and Saudi Arabia has not stopped and we are making progress, but slowly. The full interview will be aired on Wednesday. "We have done our best to avoid a military confrontation between Iran and Saudi Arabia, and our efforts have succeeded," PM Khan said. Earlier, the prime minister said in his speech

to the National Assembly that his Pakistani Government's efforts to end tensions in the region continue, but there are some spoilers who are against Iran-Saudi Arabia relations. The premier said that Pakistan is trying its best to improve relations between Iran and Saudi Arabia. Prime Minister Imran Khan visited Iran on October 13, 2019 with the aim of promoting peace and security in the region.

Iran Sanctions John Bolton's Ex-Aid under Anti-Terror Law

Iran has imposed sanctions on an aide to US President Donald Trump's former national security advisor, John Bolton, who is also a current member of the so-called Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD), under the Islamic Republic's anti-terrorism law. In a statement on Monday, the Iranian Foreign Ministry said Richard Goldberg—a member of the Washington-based FDD and a former

aide to Bolton—would be subject to sanctions. The ministry underlined in the statement that the sanctions are in accordance with articles 4 and 5 of the Law on Combating Human Rights Violations and USA Adventurous and Terrorist Actions in the Region, passed by the Iranian Parliament in 2017. "To achieve the goals of the aforementioned law in imposing sanctions on American individuals who are actively involved in economic terrorism against the interests of the government and citizens of the Islamic Republic of Iran, Richard Goldberg, an affiliate to the FDD and former aide to the US national security advisor, John Bolton, will be placed under sanctions set forth in articles 6 to 8 of the said law," the statement said, Press

TV reported. Tension between Washington and Tehran entered a new phase when in May 2018, Trump unilaterally withdrew his country from a landmark 2015 nuclear deal clinched by the Islamic Republic and six world powers, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). Following its withdrawal, Washington targeted the Iranian nation with the "toughest ever" economic sanctions. It is currently ramping up efforts to kill the JCPOA completely through pushing the remaining parties to the multilateral agreement to extend a UN arms embargo on Tehran.

Turkish Speaker Voices Opposition to US Sanctions on Iran

Turkey's Parliament speaker stressed his country's opposition to the cruel sanctions the US has imposed on Iran amid the outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic, calling for enhanced cooperation between Ankara and Tehran in various fields.

In a telephone conversation with Iran's Parliament Speaker Mohammad Baqer Qalibaf on Monday, Speaker of the Grand National Assembly of Turkey Mustafa Sentop slammed the US for broadening its cruel sanctions against Iran amid the COVID-19 outbreak.

"We are opposed to these sanctions and have made it clear in all international organizations, Sentop said.

He also hailed the cultural commonalities and humanitarian interaction between the people of Turkey and Iran, calling for the expansion of bilateral relations in all fields.

For his part, Qalibaf said the Iranian Parliament is resolved to form a friendship group with Turkey immediately and promote cooperation with the neighboring country in all fields.

He also emphasized the necessity of boosting Iran-Turkey trade ties in compliance with the health protocols in order to prevent more economic losses incurred by the business people of the two countries.

In June, Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif traveled to Turkey for talks to resume trade relations affected by the coronavirus outbreak.

Austrian amb.: Iran, Austria to systematically continue expanding of ties

Austrian Ambassador to Iran Stefan Schulz said that according to the decision of the Iranian and Austrian authorities, the relations between the two countries will continue in a structured and systematic manner.

He made the remarks on the sideline of his visit to Kohgiluyeh and Boyer-Ahmad Province on Monday. Referring to the two countries' close relations, he said that the main purpose of his visit is to get acquainted with the capacities of the province to be able to help boost bilateral relations.

This visit is a continuation of President Rouhani's official visit to Austria in the past two years, during which the officials of the two countries decided to continue relations in a structured and systematic manner, he added.

Schulz said that the situation in Iran has become complicated, and in fact the cruel sanctions of the US and coronavirus have caused problems for the countries.

There are many natural and climatic similarities between Austria and Kohgiluyeh and Boyer-Ahmad Province, he added, saying that this province has been successful in terms of environment, forest and resource management.

He noted that Austria tends to willingly share its experiences with this province in the field of tourism.

Zarif Blames Rise in Extremism on Big Powers' Miscalculations

Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif said the miscalculations and big mistakes made by the superpowers have resulted in catastrophes and a surge in extremism across the globe.

The top Iranian diplomat made the remarks in a speech at the Faculty of World Studies at the University of Tehran on Monday, the second part of a five-part course in international relations entitled "World in Transition".

"Extremism was a result of miscalculations and occupation (of regional countries by world powers). The main problem, which evolved into the existing sad conditions is the problem of 'misunderstanding' and 'miscalculation', which caused both

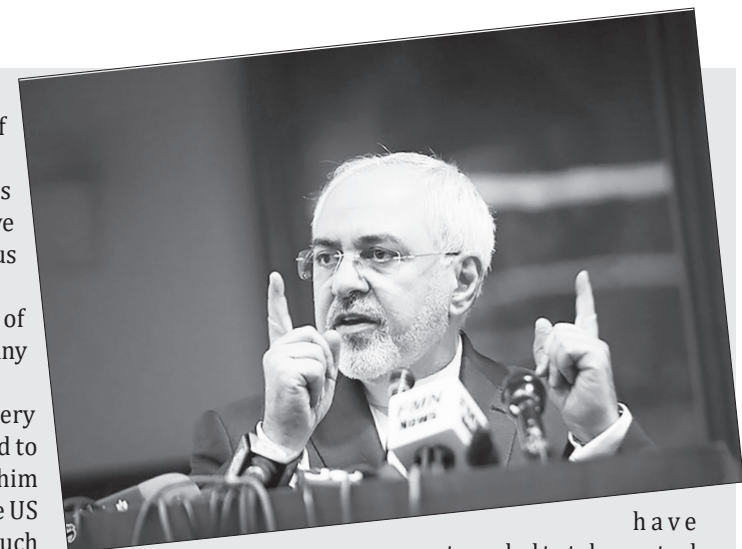
regional powers and superpowers to make mistakes, Zarif added.

"Miscalculations made by big powers, or in other words superpowers, with regard to the world's modern order have resulted in consequences, which are by far more disastrous than the mistakes made by other countries."

He also described the 2003 US-led invasion of Iraq as one of the big powers' miscalculations, saying that there were many ambiguities surrounding the attack at its onset.

"But something was conspicuous. It was clear from the very beginning that this (US) war (against Iraq) would lead to the spread of extremism in the world," Press TV quoted him as saying. Elsewhere in his speech, Zarif touched on the US withdrawal from several international treaties, and said such a policy is just similar to those bigoted and obstinate ideas that contravene the world's realities on the ground.

Some players in the international scene, like the United States,



have struggled to take control of the situation by resorting to old-dated rules and reliance on their military superiority, but their approach led to a "disaster," the Iranian top diplomat further said.

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Leader awards Imam Ali Officers Uni. with Order of Sacrifice

Leader of the Islamic Revolution has awarded Imam Ali Officers' University with the 'Flag and Order of Sacrifice' for their courage and selfless efforts in defending the country against the enemy's aggression. 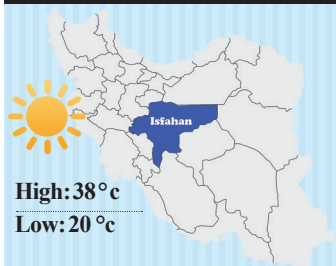

75 Years On, Japan Bomb Survivors Make Final Pleas for Abolition

As Japan marks 75 years since the devastating attacks on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the last generation of nuclear bomb survivors are working to ensure their message lives on after them.

The "hibakusha" - literally "person affected by the bomb" - have for decades been a powerful voice calling for the abolition of nuclear weapons. There are an estimated 136,700 left, many of whom were infants or unborn children at the time of the attacks.

The average age of a survivor now is a little over 83, according to Japan's health ministry, lending an urgency as they share their testimonies and call for a ban on nuclear weapons.

"What we hibakusha are saying is we can't repeat (a nuclear attack)," 88-year-old Terumi Tanaka, who survived the Nagasaki bombing, told AFP ahead of the anniversaries.

"To this end, we have to let people know what we experienced, for them to hear the facts."

Tanaka was 13 when the bomb hit his hometown. The attack on Nagasaki killed 74,000 people and came three days after a first bomb devastated the city of Hiroshima, killing 140,000.

He has spent much of his life sharing his experience, hoping that explaining the horrors of nuclear weapons will convince people to support a ban.

But he recognizes that the community of those who lived through the attacks is shrinking, and their message will have to be passed on by others in the decades to come.

"We will all pass away, eventually," he said.

"We set up a group called No More Hibakusha Project, which works on preserving records as archives, including what we've written... so that (the next generation) can use them in their campaigns." Tanaka worries at times that interest is fading, acknowledging that speeches by hibakusha often attract no more than a handful of people.

"We do our best," he said. "But if no one comes, it's a swing and a miss."

At 74, Jiro Hamasumi is among the youngest survivors of the attacks. His mother was pregnant with him in Hiroshima when the bomb struck.

It killed his father, most likely instantaneously, and claimed several other relatives in the aftermath.

"Not a day goes by when I don't think about my father," he told AFP.

His knowledge of the attack comes from the accounts of his siblings, who described the dizzying flash and ear-splitting roar that formed the first indication the bomb known as Little Boy had detonated.

His father was at work when the bomb hit, just a few hundred meters from the epicentre. Hamasumi's mother and siblings tried to reach his office the day after but were forced back by the "heat and smell of burned flesh".

When they finally reached his father's office, they found only "something resembling his body". All they could retrieve were a few metal items that survived the flames - a belt buckle, a key and part of his wallet.

Born in February 1946, Hamasumi escaped the physical effects experienced by many children exposed to radiation in the womb.

But the attack has defined his life, and he has spent decades campaigning against nuclear weapons.

"To me, the nuclear umbrella only means the mushroom cloud," Hamasumi said.

"Hibakusha want the United States to apologize to us, but the proof of the apology is nuclear abolition, we're not after vengeance."

As the hibakusha age, they are passing the baton to young activists, many from Hiroshima and Nagasaki, who have grown up steeped in the memories of survivors.

Mitsuhiro Hayashida, 28, is the grandchild of a Nagasaki hibakusha and organizes events for survivors to share their stories.

He also helps oversee an international online petition for a ban on nuclear weapons, which has garnered more than 11 million signatures. But he too worries that the attacks are fading from collective memory.

"Today, the children and grandchildren of survivors, like me, are campaigning, but the weight of our words is probably less than half of the testimonies of survivors," he told AFP.

"We really need the world to move towards nuclear abolition while atomic bomb survivors are alive."

UN Chief Warns World Facing 'Generational Catastrophe' on Education

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres warned on Tuesday that the world faces a "generational catastrophe" because of school closures amid the coronavirus pandemic and said that getting students safely back to the classroom must be "a top priority."

"Once local transmission of COVID-19 is under control, getting students back into schools and learning institutions as safely as possible must be a top priority, he said. "Consultation with parents, carers, teachers and young people is fundamental."

Guterres said that as of mid-July schools were closed in some 160 countries, affecting more than 1 billion students, while at least 40 million children have missed out on pre-school.

This came on top of more than 250 million children already being out of school before the pandemic and only a quarter of secondary school students in developing countries leaving with basic skills, he said in a video statement.

"Now we face a generational catastrophe that could waste untold human potential, undermine decades of progress, and exacerbate entrenched inequalities," said Guterres as he launched a UN "Save our

Future" campaign.

"Once local transmission of COVID-19 is under control, getting students back into schools and learning institutions as safely as possible must be a top priority, he said. "Consultation with parents, carers, teachers and young people is fundamental."

The UN recommendations for getting global education back on track come as US President Donald Trump pushes for schools to reopen in the face of opposition from some teachers and parents while COVID-19 is surging in many parts of the country.

The coronavirus, which first appeared in China late last year, has infected 4.6 million people in the United States and killed more than 155,000 Americans since February, according to a Reuters tally. Deaths rose by over 25,000 in July and cases doubled in 19 states during the month.

Globally the coronavirus has infected at least 18.1 million people and there have been more than 689,000 known deaths worldwide, according to the Reuters tally.

WHO envoy says domestic productions helping Iran to cope with COVID-19 pandemic

Representative of the World Health Organization in Iran Christoph Hamelmann said that Iran has achieved potentials producing medical and pharmaceutical equipment, adding that the capabilities help Iranian health system cope with COVID-19. Speaking to reporters, Hamelmann said that Iran produces gowns for medical staff and personal protective equipment and launched production lines

of all the supplies the health system needs by relying on domestic capabilities to fight coronavirus.

Due to the fact that after China, coronavirus spread in Iran, many measures were taken for fighting it and the experience was used also by the World Health Organization.

One of the most important measures taken by Iran in fighting coronavirus was to create capacity and increase diagnostic capacity by taking advantage of laboratories, the WHO envoy said.

He added that another good experience achieved by Iran which can be used by Primary Health Care (PHC) was active diagnostics, referring patients



to medical centers and delivery of health and medical services. He also hailed Iran successful experience in drawing social distancing protocols in workplace.

Hamelmann appreciated the efforts made by Iranian Health Ministry with regard to control and inspections aiming to prevent further spread of corona virus outbreak.
