## نبودمهارت، چالش مهم معضل بیکاری

مدیرکل تعاون، کار و رفاه اجتماعی استان اصفهان: جوانان به دلیل نداشتن مهارت لازم نمی‌توانند وارد بازار کار شوند

مدیرعامل شرکت توزیع برق شهرستان اصفهان اعلام کرد:

حذف قبوض کاغذی به عنوان یک طرح کلان ملی علاوه بر صرفه جویی میلیاردی و حذف ارزبری در تکمیل زیرساخت‌های مدیریت کشور، ارایه خدمات الکترونیک شرکت برق را از ۹۵ درصد نزدیک به ۱۰۰ درصد افزایش داده است.



### بازسازی شبکه‌های برق شهری و روستایی

پیرپیران هم‌زمان با اشاره به ضرورت کاهش تلفات در شبکه برق افزود: در سال ۹۳ کاهش تلفات در اصفهان حدود ۷٫۹ درصد بوده که این میزان در سال جاری به ۶ درصد رسیده است و پیش‌بینی می‌شود در چشم‌انداز سال ۱۴۰۵ این میزان تلفات به کمتر از ۵ درصد (میانگین استاندارد جهانی) برسد و به وجود ریزش‌ها نیز اشاره کرد و گفت: هیچ مجوزی در اصفهان در خصوص ریزش‌ها تا کنون صادر نشده است و این موضوع باید مالکان راه‌آهن‌ساز کند چرا که برخی از مستاجران اقدام به نصب غیرقانونی ماینرها می‌کنند و این سبب می‌شود تا مصرف برق خانگی روند رو به رشدی را پیدا کند در نتیجه مالکان باید حتماً با مراجعه به سایت شرکت توزیع برق اصفهان میزان مصرف ملک خود را مشاهده و رصد کنند.

### اتصال ۶۰۰ نقطه شبکه برق به تجهیزات اتوماسیون

وی به زیرساز می‌بمان شهری در شهر گنبدکای فیروزآباد اشاره کرد و گفت: نزدیک به دو هزار و ۵۲۱ دستگاه چراغ LED و ۵۶ اصله پایه فلزی جدید برای زیبایی شهر اصفهان نصب شده است. مدیرعامل شرکت توزیع برق اصفهان در خصوص هوشمندسازی نقاط قطع و وصل و قرائت هوشمندانه گفت: نزدیک به ۲۱ هزار کنتور هوشمند پارامترهای شبکه‌ها را رصد می‌کنند و همچنین در حال حاضر ۶۰۰ نقطه شبکه برق به تجهیزات اتوماسیون متصل هستند. همچنین در جهت جذب اشعاع مشترکان ۳۲۰ کنتور دیماند و ۲۲ هزار ۷۶۸ کنتور عالی به منظور برقراری به مشترکان جدید نصب شده است.

### هیچ مجوز ریزش‌ها تا کنون صادر نشده است

این مطلب را حمیدرضا پیرپیران مدیرعامل شرکت توزیع برق شهرستان اصفهان عنوان کرد و گفت: هدف ما به طور کلی در پروژه‌های مدیریتی و سامانه‌های الکترونیک کاهش مراجعات حضوری است، به طوری که ۲۸ خدمت در حوزه خدمات مشترکان و ۱۲ خدمت در حوزه بهره‌برداری و اتفاقات که در کل ۴۰ نوع خدمت است، در اپلیکیشن «برق من» توسط شرکت راه‌اندازی شده است و با اشاره به اقدامات این شرکت برای غیرحضوری کردن خدمات یادآور شد: راه‌اندازی سامانه سمیع (۱۵۲۱) امکانات زیادی را برای مشترکان و متقاضیان فراهم کرده که این خدمات موجب شد در زمان انتشار ویروس کرونا اهمیت تحقق دولت الکترونیک و ارائه خدمات غیرحضوری بیش از پیش نمایان شده و مشترکان و متقاضیان به راحتی خدمات خود را تنها با یک تلفن دریافت کنند.

وی اضافه کرد: وجود درگاه‌های متفاوت خدمت‌رسانی به طور قطع شرایط مناسب‌تری را برای ارائه خدمات ایجاد می‌کند و در همین راستا مشترکان برق با نصب اپلیکیشن «برق من» روی گوشی همراه خود می‌توانند سوابق صورتحساب، ثبت قرائت توسط مشترک (خود) اظهاری، خدمات فروش و پس‌از فروش، ثبت خاموشی، اعلام مشکل روشنایی معابر، اطلاعات برق امید، مدیریت مصرف و غیره را مشاهده و در هر زمینه‌ای بدون حضور در مراکز خدماتی و پیشخوان‌های دولت، خدمات را به ساده‌ترین روش ممکن دریافت کنند.

## Tire output climbs 20% in 10 months on year

Production of tires in Iran has risen 20 percent during the first ten months of the current Iranian calendar year (March 20, 2020-January 19, 2021), compared to the same period of time in the past year. Some 225,269 tons of tires have been produced during the ten-month period of this year.

In terms of number, a 20-percent growth has been also achieved through the production of 20.913 million tires.

As reported, 132,741 passenger car tires were produced in the mentioned time span, showing a 24-percent growth.

Some 20,695 tons of van tires were produced, indicating a nine-percent growth. Also, 47,859 tons of truck and bus tires were produced, showing a 15-percent rise.

Production of the tires of light agricultural vehicles experienced a growth of 49 percent to stand at 3,609 tons, and that of the heavy ones rose 13 percent to stand at 15,081 tons. Meanwhile, 5,284 tons of road building and industrial vehicle tires were produced, with a 13-percent growth compared to the first ten months of the past year.

The bicycle and motorcycle tire output stood at 16,182 tons, indicating 32 percent growth. In early August 2020, an official with Iran's Industry, Mining, and Trade Ministry said that increasing the amount of investment making for the production of the tire in the country is a necessity.

Kamran Kargar, the acting head of planning, supplying, and market regulating office of the ministry, said the consumption of tires is noticeable in Iran due to the country's big transportation fleet.

"Now the ground is properly prepared for the production of light and heavy vehicle tires in the country, and investment making will play a significant role both for the establishment of new production units and for launching development projects", the official noted.

Having an annual production capacity of 426,000 tons of tire, Iran accounts for 41 percent of tire output in the West Asian region, according to the deputy director of the non-metal industries office of the Iranian Industry, Mining, and Trade Ministry. Mohsen Safdari has said that 11 tire production units are active in the country creating jobs for 14,500 people.

He said 426,000 tons is the nominal capacity, while the real output is less than this figure as some units are working with 60-70 percent of their capacity.

"Iranian tire industry is dependent on foreign raw materials by 40 percent, so we are self-reliant by 60 percent in this field", the official announced.

In a bid to nullify the U.S. sanctions, Iran is determined to strengthen its domestic production to achieve self-reliance.

Selecting the motto of "Pickup in Production" for the previous Iranian calendar year (March 2019-March 2020), and the slogan of "Surge in Production" for the current year indicates the Islamic Republic's determination to achieve this goal.

To this end, the Iranian ministries besides the private sector have been outlining their programs for the surge in production.

## Iran's Qeshm Island can be export hub of petrochemical products: official

Managing Director of Iran's National Petrochemical Company Behzad Mohammadi said on Saturday that Qeshm Island has an exceptional position to turn into hub of construction, development, production, and export of a variety of petrochemical products.



Mohammadi made the remarks in a press conference in Tehran on Saturday.

He said that the coasts of the Persian Gulf and the Oman Sea have a great potential for the development of the petrochemical industry and so far permits have been issued for the development of petrochemical industries in Qeshm Island, Special Parsian Economic Zone, Bandar-e-Jask, and Iran's Mokran Coasts. Mokran coastal region is located in Baluchestan province in southeastern Iran and southwestern Pakistan, it is a 600-mi (1,000-km) stretch along the Gulf of Oman from

Ra's (cape) al-Küh, Iran (west of Jask), to Lasbela District, Pakistan (near Karachi).

Mokran is a semi-desert coastal strip in the South of Sistan and Baluchestan, in Pakistan and Iran, along the Persian Gulf and the Sea of Oman.

According to official statistics, about 40,000 jobs have been created directly and two to 3,000 indirectly.

Iran's Mokran coastal area are the perfect places for the development of the petrochemical industry and, given the

wide availability of gas resources, are highly valuable for this region's development.

The strategic position of Mokran coasts, along the Sea of Oman, the new port will be established to increase Iran's marine traffic in international waters and the oceans.

Governor-General of Hormozgan province Fereidoun Hemmati too on Nov 20, 2020, said that petroleum and refinery mega projects are being done in Jask County, adding that Mokran Coasts will become

Iran's new energy and petrochemical industry hub soon.

Fereidoun Hemmati who had visited the implementing process of oil and refinery projects in the coasts of Mokran told local media on Friday that mega projects in the oil transmission line, the oil export terminal, and the port and offshore oil export are underway in Jask County.

"Mokran coastline can play a special role in the future of marine exchanges," Hemmati added.

## Renewable power generation capacity exceeds 850 MW

The capacity of Iran's renewable power plants reached 859.17 megawatts (MW) in the tenth Iranian calendar month of Dey (December 21, 2020-January 19, 2021), IRNA reported on Thursday.

As reported, Iranian renewable power plants managed to produce 5.738 billion kilowatt-hours (Kwh) of electricity in the mentioned month, 50 percent (426.17 MW) of which was produced by solar power plants. Wind power plants also accounted for 35 percent (303.18 MW) of the total output, followed by hydropower plants which had a 12-percent share (105.65 MW) of the total production.

Back in December 2020, Mohammad Satakin, who heads Iran's Renewable

Energy and Energy Efficiency Organization (SATBA), said the capacity of the country's renewable power plants is going to reach 1,000 MW (one gigawatt) by the end of the current government's incumbency (August 2021). Also, Director General of SATBA Potential Assessment and Resource Evaluation Office Mitra Gholami has said that over the past three years, SATBA has successfully identified regions for the construction of 121,500 MW capacity of renewable power plants across the country by conducting potential assessment studies.

Overall, in the next five years, Iran is aiming for a 5,000 MW increase in renewable capacity to meet growing domestic demand and expand its presence in the regional electricity market. According to SATBA, the number of small-scale solar power plants across the country

which are used by households or small industries is also increasing noticeably as Iranian households and small industries are embracing the new technology with open arms and investors also seem eager for more contribution in this area. Iran is also planning on expanding its presence in the region's renewable energy market. Iranian Energy Minister Reza Ardakanian said in December 2020 that the country has great potentials in the field of renewable energies and can have a significant role in developing the region's market for such energies. "Relying on the high potential of renewable energy sources, including solar, wind, biomass, geothermal, etc., the Energy Ministry has planned good measures in order to implement new policies for creating positive changes in the development of the country's renewable energy sector," the minister said.

## South Pars development nearly completed

The managing director of Pars Oil and Gas Company (POGC), which is in charge of developing Iran's giant South Pars gas field, has said that the development of the mentioned field is nearly completed and all phases of the field will be fully operational in near future.

"This [Iranian calendar] year (ends on March 20), the development of the large gas field will be nearly completed and we will not have any work left except for phase 11 in the offshore sector and the refinery of phase 14 in the onshore sector; which will be operational early next year," Mohammad Meshkinfam told IRIB on Thursday.

South Pars, which Iran shares with Qatar in the Persian Gulf waters, is currently divided into 24 standard offshore phases, the output of which is processed by 14 gas refineries on land.

According to Meshkinfam, the first train of the South Pars phase 14 Refinery is going to go operational early next Iranian calendar year (begins on March 21), after which every three months another train will be inaugurated, and by the end of the next Iranian calendar year (March 20, 2022) this refinery will be fully operational.

Underlining the reliance of domestic capacities and capabilities for the development of the mentioned field, Meshkinfam noted: "In the beginning, only 33 percent of the required equipment in this field was produced in Iran, but today 75 percent of the necessary equipment has been indigenized." Initially, the first two projects of the field, namely phase two and three and phase four and five, were carried out with the participation of France's Total and Italy's Eni, but after that, the remaining phases were developed by Iranian companies, he explained.

## Commodities worth \$518m exported from Gilan Province

An official with the customs department of Gilan Province, in the north of Iran, said that 877,393 tons of commodities valued at \$518.7 million have been exported from the province during the first ten months of the current Iranian calendar year (March 20, 2020-January 19, 2021). Abolqasem Yousefinejad said that the export from the province in the mentioned time span indicates a 46-percent rise in terms of value, and a

33-percent growth in terms of weight, as compared to the corresponding time in the previous year. He mentioned vegetable products, minerals, foodstuff, weaving products, and plastic products as the major exported commodities, and Russia, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Georgia, Afghanistan, and Iraq as the main export destinations in the said time. The official said that Gilan Provinces accounted for 25 percent of the value and 37 percent of the worth of Iran's non-oil exports to the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU)'s member states in the ten-month period.

### Iran's Envoy Skeptical about Biden's Policy on Yemen

Iran's ambassador to Sana'a said he is not optimistic about the US president's call for ending the war in Yemen.

In a tweet on Friday, Hassan Irloo downplayed Joe Biden's recent comments about the US' push to step up diplomacy to end the war in Yemen, saying, "I am not optimistic about the remarks from Americans."

"The new US administration's policy is certainly different from the previous administration, which is imposing direct political and military presence in Yemen, like what happened in Iraq and Syria," the Iranian ambassador said.

Irloo also stressed the need to rely only on God and the people of Yemen, who have displayed "historic patience and resistance" and will go on until "ultimate victory".

In a speech at the US State Department on Thursday, Biden said he was stepping up diplomacy to end "a war which has created a humanitarian and strategic catastrophe" in Yemen.

"I've asked my Middle East team to ensure our support for the United Nations-led initiative to impose a ceasefire, open humanitarian channels, and restore long-dormant peace talks," the new US president said.

Saudi Arabia and a coalition of its vassal states launched the war on Yemen in March 2015 in an attempt to reinstall a Riyadh-backed former regime.

Saudi Arabia and a number of its regional allies, chief among them the United Arab Emirates, launched the war on Yemen in March 2015, with the goal of bringing the government of Riyadh-allied former President Abd Rabbouh Mansour Hadi back to power and crushing popular Ansarullah Houthi movement.

The war has claimed more than 100,000 lives in Yemen, according to the US-based Armed Conflict Location and Event Data Project (ACLED), a nonprofit conflict-research organization.

### Minister: Launch of Zoljanah satellite carrier proves Iran scientific power

Minister of Defense and Logistics of the Armed Forces Brigadier General Amir Hatami hailed launch of satellite carrier called Zoljanah, saying that it was a breakthrough and proved Iran's scientific power.

He made the remarks in a meeting held in India with secretary of Indian Union Muslim League and a number of Iranian university students residing there, according to the public relations office of Ministry of Defense.

Hatami left Iranian capital for New Delhi, India, on Tuesday afternoon (February 2) to meet with Indian officials and attend Indian Ocean Region (IOR) Defense Ministers' Conclave as part of Aero India 2021.

By launching Zoljanah with solid fuel engine, the Iranian youth proved that they spare no effort to achieve science, knowledge and technology to reach the peak of success, the defense minister said.

Iran, today, relies on its indigenous capacities in all scientific fields, he added.

During his speech to IOR Defense Ministers' Conclave on Thursday, Hatami said developments of the recent

decades tell all that the today's world is in dire need of re-organizing its system to make the globe get rid of current polarizations.

Prior to his speech to the IOR meeting, Hatami held talks with his Indian counterpart Rajnath Singh, and said during the talks that anti-colonialism and anti-oppression moves are among top commonalities between the two nations.



## U.S. rejoining the agreement is not a given; U.S expert

"Sanctions relief for Iran will come from the Biden administration after it assesses that Iran is a good-faith partner in nuclear negotiations," the U.S Professor Karl Kaltenthaler told in an exclusive interview with ILNA news agency.



Kaltenthaler who specializes in international security issues and the politics of the Middle East

and South Asia believes that a lot of things have changed since the U.S. left the JCPOA. Adding that one is the ascendancy of more hardline politicians in Iran and another is more aggressive Iranian policies and postures in the Middle East. He continued "Biden's policies will make some allies and adversaries uneasy with the U.S. and even possibly more antagonistic." He is a Professor of Political Science and Director of Security Studies at the University of Akron. He specializes in international security issues, violent extremism, and the politics of the Middle East and South Asia.

You can read his interview with ILNA news agency as follows:

Q: How is U.S. foreign policy likely to change under a Biden administration?  
A: U.S. foreign policy will definitely change under Biden. There will be a greater emphasis on multilateralism, shoring up relationships with allies, and restoring U.S. leadership on key issues such as climate and support for democracy. This will make some Americans pleased but will anger others who were happy with Trump's "America First" approach.

Q: Can Biden repair America's alliances?  
A: Biden will make some allies rest easy that the United States will revert



back to many of the postures that it took prior to Trump, but Biden's policies will make some allies and adversaries uneasy with the U.S. and even possibly more antagonistic. It is not hard to imagine that relations with Saudi Arabia and Israel will become more strained under Biden's foreign policy. It is also fairly likely that relations between Russia and the U.S. will deteriorate because of intense Russian distrust of Biden. It is likely that relations with China will remain strained as both countries have reasons to distrust the intentions of the other and China's increasingly aggressive policies in its region will make repairing the U.S.-China relationship difficult to accomplish.

Q: What's behind the latest European bid to save the JCPOA?  
A: Europe would very much like to revive the JCPOA. A nuclear-armed Iran is a very troubling scenario for Europe to contemplate. Also, the Europeans want stability in the relationship with Iran, both between Iran and Europe and between Iran and the United States. Economic opportunities await Europe if there is a more normal and stable relationship with Iran.

Q: Will the last nuclear deal survive or will another deal be formed?

### Guterres: UN Will Seek to Unite World, Reverse Myanmar Coup

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres pledged Friday that the United Nations will do everything it can to unite the international community and create conditions for the military coup in Myanmar to be reversed.

The UN chief told a news conference it is "absolutely essential" to carry out the Security Council's calls for a return to democracy, respect for the results of the November parliamentary elections, and release of all people detained by the military, "which means the reversal of the coup that took place."

"It is absolutely essential that that moves forward, and for that, I believe, we need to have all possible areas of pressure to make it happen," Guterres said, AP reported.

Myanmar's military announced Monday on the eve of the meeting of new Parliament that it will take power for one year, accusing leader Aung San Suu Kyi's government of not investigating allegations of voter fraud in the November elections, where its party did poorly. It detained Suu Kyi, whose party swept that vote, and other lawmakers, activists, journalists and members of civil society. The election commission had refuted the military's allegations.

In its first statement following the military's takeover on Thursday, the Security Council "stressed the need to uphold democratic institutions and processes, refrain from violence, and fully respect human rights, fundamental freedoms and the rule of law." It also "emphasized the need for the continued support of the democratic transition in Myanmar."

Guterres said Christine Schraner Burgener, the UN special envoy for Myanmar, had a first contact Friday with the military since the coup and expressed the UN's strong opposition to the takeover.

According to UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric, she reiterated to Deputy Commander-in-Chief Vice Gen. Soe Win "the secretary-general's strong condemnation of the military's action that disrupted the democratic reforms that were taking place in the country."

Schraner Burgener also reiterated her call for the immediate release of all detainees and emphasized the need for progress on the safe and voluntary repatriation of the Rohingya refugees, Dujarric said, calling it "an important conversation."

More than 700,000 Rohingya have fled from Myanmar to Bangladesh since August 2017, when the military launched a clearance operation in response to attacks by a rebel group. The security forces have been accused of mass rapes, killings and the burning of thousands of homes. A year ago, the UN's top court, the International Court of Justice, ordered Myanmar to do all it can to prevent genocide against the Rohingya, a Muslim minority.

Guterres said Schraner Burgener is also in contact with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

Brunei, which chairs the 10-nation regional group, including Myanmar, issued a statement Monday noting the bloc's principles include "the adherence to the principles of democracy, the rule of law and good governance, respect for and protection of human rights and fundamental freedoms."

### Iran Opens Shoulder-Fired Missile, Hybrid Solid Propellant Plants

The Chief of Staff of the Iranian Armed Forces on Saturday opened factories producing advanced shoulder-fired missiles and hybrid solid fuel for various missiles used in ground warfare.

In comments after inaugurating the missile factory, Major General Mohammad Hossein Baqeri described it as "one of the most unique plants in the region producing short-range air defense missiles."

The new projectiles are manufactured with sophisticated and modern laser and optical technologies for navigation and control, the commander noted, saying man-portable rocket launchers for air defense purposes can be employed by troops in various tactical conditions.

The top commander said while Iran used to import the first generation of shoulder-fired missiles, it is now a

manufacturer of various advanced missiles with a range of around 5 kilometers and capable of hitting different types of approaching and receding targets with different velocities.

Iran is now among the three or four countries in the world with the technical know-how to manufacture shoulder-launched assault weapons, employed for air defense at low and medium altitudes, he added.

Major General Baqeri also opened a hybrid solid propellant factory supplying fuel for ground combat weapons.

It was necessary to extend the range and speed of missiles fired in the ground combats, the general said, adding that the new solid fuel would boost the power of tactical ground-to-ground, anti-tank and air defense missiles.

Iranian military experts and technicians have in recent years made great headways in manufacturing a broad range of indigenous equipment, making the armed forces self-sufficient in the arms sphere.



Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei has repeatedly called for efforts to maintain and boost Iran's defense capabilities, hitting back at the enemies for disputing the country's missile program.

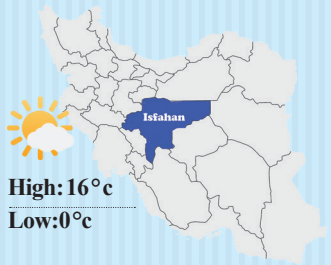

## Number of COVID19- Vaccinations Worldwide Exceeds Number of Cases: WHO Chief

The number of COVID19- vaccinations has now overtaken the number of cases reported since the start of the pandemic, WHO Director General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus told reporters.

In his words, this move would be "the best way to protect the rest of their own population."

"Globally, the number of vaccinations has now overtaken the number of reported infections," he said. "In one sense, that's good news, and a remarkable achievement in such a short timeframe. But more than three quarters of those vaccinations are in just 10 countries that account for almost 60% of global GDP."

In this regard, Ghebreyesus called upon the countries that have already vaccinated their high-risk groups, such as healthcare workers and the elderly, to "share vaccines" with other states. In his words, this move would be "the best way to protect the rest of their own population."

"The longer it takes to vaccinate those most at risk everywhere, the more opportunity we give the virus to mutate and evade vaccines," he said, adding that almost 130 countries, home to 2.5 billion people in

total, are yet to administer a single dose of a vaccine, TASS reported.

He called for "a massive scale-up in production" of COVID-19 vaccines. In his opinion, pharmaceutical companies worldwide should help each other by providing access to their manufacturing infrastructure to support such production. He also called upon companies to issue non-exclusive licenses to allow other producers to manufacture their vaccine, similar to the mechanism earlier used for medicines to treat HIV and hepatitis C.

"This sharing of knowledge and data could enable immediate use of untapped production capacity and help build additional manufacturing bases, especially in Africa, Asia, and Latin America," he said. The World Health Organization (WHO) said in its daily bulletin that as of 19:00 Moscow time on February 5, as many as 104,370,550 novel coronavirus cases and 2,271,180 coronavirus-associated deaths had been registered across the globe. The number of confirmed cases grew by 355,041 in the past 24 hours and the number of fatalities increased by 10,422.

## US to Revoke Blacklisting of Yemen's Ansarullah

The US plans to revoke the terrorist designations on Yemen's Houthi Ansarullah movement that were put in place in the final months of the Trump administration, the State Department said on Friday night. The reversal, confirmed by a State Department official, comes a day after President Joe Biden declared a halt to US support for the Saudi Arabia-led military campaign in Yemen.

"Our action is due entirely to the humanitarian consequences of this last-minute designation from the

prior administration, which the United Nations and humanitarian organizations have since made clear would accelerate the world's worst humanitarian crisis," the official said, according to Reuters.

Democratic Senator Chris Murphy welcomed the decision. "The designation ... stopped food and other critical aid from being delivered inside Yemen and would have prevented effective political negotiation," he said in a statement. The United Nations describes Yemen as the world's biggest humanitarian crisis, with 80% of its people in need. "We welcome the stated intention by the US administration to revoke the designation as it will provide

profound relief to millions of Yemenis who rely on humanitarian assistance and commercial imports to meet their basic survival needs," UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric said.

Former US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo blacklisted the Houthis on Jan. 19 - a day before Biden took office.

The Trump administration exempted aid groups, the United Nations, the Red Cross and the export of agricultural commodities, medicine and medical devices from its designation. But UN officials and relief groups said the carve-outs were not enough and called for the designation to be revoked.
