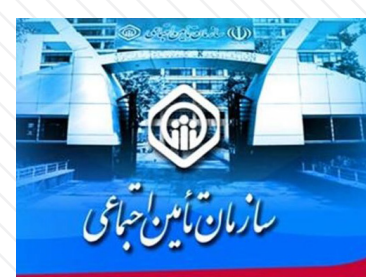

Iran's Foreign Trade Surpasses \$65 Billion

The value of Iran's foreign trade in the year that ends on March 20 has reached close to \$65.5 billion, an official said.

Head of the Trade Promotion Organization of Iran said at a conference on Wednesday that the value of the country's foreign trade so far in the Iranian year 1399 (March 2020-March 2021) has stood at around \$65.5 billion despite all sanctions, banking problems and transportation difficulties. The figures show that the value of Iran's exports and imports have decreased by 19% and 15%, respectively, compared to the previous year, Hamid Zadboom noted.

The governor of the Central Bank of Iran had announced in January that Tehran has adopted such plans that domestic production and foreign trade would not be harmed even if the sanctions are kept in place.

Abdolnasser Hemmati has emphasized that Iran would never return to previous conditions because of the Central Bank's policies, the ongoing plans, tools designed to handle the situation, and monetary policies to eliminate the budget deficit.

2nd part of Indian equipment soon to arrive at Chabahar

Managing Director of Ports and Maritime Organization of Sistan and Baluchestan province, in the south east of Iran, said that the second part of India's \$85m commitment for developing Chabahar port would be unveiled soon.

Behrouz Aqaei said on Wednesday that a vessel carrying two 100-ton coastal cranes worth 7.5 million dollars would arrive in Iran next week with two other machines to be delivered later this year.

India committed to provide 85 million dollars of equipment in Shahid Beheshti port through an investment contract. Two 140-ton coastal cranes have already been delivered, according to the official.

With two other vehicles coming next week and two others later in the year, India will have fulfilled 30 percent of its commitments, Aqaei stated, adding, "after that, there would be no limitation in loading and unloading any type of goods in Shahid Beheshti port."

Chabahar is a developing port complex in the southeast of Iran which is planned to be a hub of trading in the region, connecting Iran and Afghanistan to South East Asia and Africa, and India to Iran and Afghanistan.

Water Levels in Tehran Dams Decline

The five dams supplying water to Tehran hold 567 million cubic meters of water, which is 64 mcm less than the same time last year, deputy for water and hydropower affairs at the Tehran Regional Water Company said.

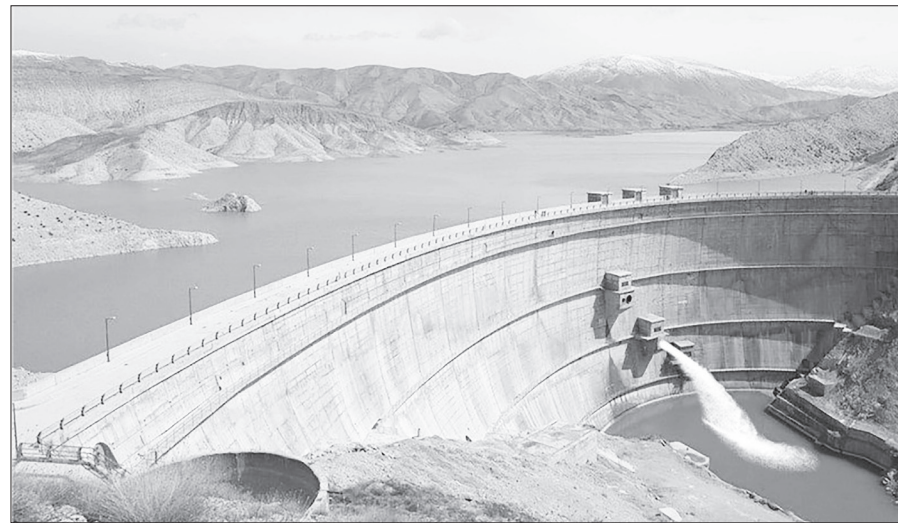


"Since the beginning of the current water year [Sept 22, 2020], 379 mcm of water has entered the dams, which is 4% less compared to the 396 mcm in the same period last year," ILNA quoted Mohammad Shahriari as saying.

"Water inflow in dams has been declining sharply. While 91.9 mcm of water entered the dams from Feb 19 to March 6 last year, the flow has fallen to 51 mcm this year -- down 45%," he added.

Referring to less rain as the reason for the decrease in dam levels, he said: "Since the beginning of the water year, we have had 191 mm of rainfall in the province, which is 24% less than the same period last year when Tehran registered 252 mm."

Pointing to the significant decline in rainfall in the 16-day period (Feb 19-March 6) this year compared to a year ago, Shahriari



said, "Last year we logged 85 mm of rain in the period while this year it was 5.2 mm. This means more than 90% decrease in rainfall that has impacted the runoff and the amount of water entering the dams resulting in a reduction of 64 mcm of water level in Tehran reservoirs."

The five dams supplying Tehran include Taleqan, Latyan, Mamlou, Amir Kabir and Lar. Together they can hold 2 billion cubic meters of water. Giving a breakdown, Shahriari said Taleqan and Mamlou now have 268 mcm and 145 mcm, respectively.

The storage level in Taleqan Dam is now 8 mcm less than last year and in Mamlou, it has declined by 40 mcm.

Amir Kabir Dam holds 101 mcm of water, down 4 mcm compared

to last year. Water behind Lar and Latyan is 24 mcm and 28 mcm, respectively. The two dams have registered declines of 4 mcm and 8 mcm compared to a year ago.

Tehran Regional Water Company is struggling to implement water infrastructure projects because of cumbersome regulations and the bloated bureaucracy plus the lack of cooperation from state bodies like the Department of Environment and Municipality.

Giving an example, he said the DOE does not allow TRWC increase water transfer from Lar Dam to the east of the capital as the dam is a habitat for red spot trouts, "an issue that can and should be resolved if they (DoE) cooperate".

Tehran's population density is 973 per square kilometer, which is 20 times over and above the national average. With nearly 13.5 million people, the capital has 16.5% share of the total population.

Tehran accounts for less than 1.1% of the country's land area, but is home to 16.5% of the population and 45% of the industrial base.

Shahriari hoped that with better rains in the first two months of spring, the water situation will improve. Potable water consumption in Tehran Province jumped to 626 million cubic meters in the last water year that ended on Sept. 22, 2020. Farmers and industries consumed 14% and 8% more water compared to a year ago.

Oil Falls After Hitting Pandemic High \$70

Oil prices slipped on Monday after earlier climbing above \$70 a barrel for the first time since the Covid-19 pandemic began after attacks on Saudi Arabian oil facilities.

Yemen's Houthi forces fired drones and missiles at the heart of the Saudi oil industry on Sunday, including a Saudi Aramco facility at Ras Tanura vital to petroleum exports.

Riyadh said there were no casualties or

loss of property, CNBC reported.

Benchmark Brent climbed as high as \$71.38 a barrel in early Asian trade, its highest since Jan. 8, 2020, but later in the day it was trading down 30 cents or 0.4% at \$69.06.

US West Texas Intermediate crude was down 22 cents or 0.3% at \$65.87 after touching \$67.98 a barrel, its highest since October 2018.

Brent and WTI prices have climbed for four consecutive sessions. "There are no reports of lasting damage or disruptions to oil flows ... Today's risk premium will

soon fade," said Norbert Rucker, analyst at Swiss bank Julius Baer.

The attack follows last week's move by the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, Russia and their oil producing allies, known as OPEC+, to agree on broadly sticking with output cuts despite rising crude prices.

Adding support, the US Senate approved a \$1.9 trillion stimulus bill, which is expected to boost fuel demand as the economy gets a lift. Economic data from the United States and China was also positive.

Iran-EU 2020 Trade Down 13%

Iran exported €618.03 million worth of commodities to EU last year, indicating a 7.18% YOY fall while imports from EU dropped by 14.32% to stand at €3.62 billion in 2020 Trade between Iran and 27 EU member states in 2020 stood at €4.24 billion, registering a 13.35% decline compared with €4.89 billion in 2019, latest data provided by the European Statistical Office show.

Germany, Italy and the Netherlands were Iran's top three trading partners in the European bloc with bilateral exchanges standing at €1.72 billion, €664.1 million and €372.75 million, respectively.

Iran's trade with Cyprus (€12.63 million), Luxembourg (€1.54 million) and Bulgaria (€115.3) increased by 123%, 65% and 17.66% respectively year-on-year, which were the highest among EU states.



Armenia, Iran's Zanjan province pursue economic cooperation: Official

A roadmap is ready for promoting economic and trade cooperation between Armenia and Iran's Zanjan province, Chairman of Zanjan Chamber of Commerce Ali Yeganeh Fard says.

Speaking in a meeting with the Armenian Ambassador to Iran Artashes Toumanian, Yeganeh Fard said on Wednesday that the roadmap consists of 10-year capacities of the province in terms of exports of its own products as well as capacities of other countries involving in trade exchanges with Zanjan.

Zanjan province enjoys export capabilities in different sectors, including agriculture, fisheries, industries such as producing copper, silver, knives, and electrical products, he noted.

Pointing to holding joint exhibitions in the province to promote economic cooperation between Armenia and Zanjan, the official argued that the two sides can hold an online meeting to discuss trade and economic consultations and expand the exchange of information among businessmen of both sides.

The Iranian official also invited Armenian economic activists to visit Zanjan province and become acquainted with the capacities of the province, adding that Zanjan investors can invest in Armenia's agriculture and fisheries.

Lack of information hinders collaborations. For his part, Armenian Ambassador Artashes Toumanian called for the expansion of economic ties between Zanjan province and his country.

Emphasizing direct trade and investment as the two priorities of cooperation between the two sides, he said that holding economic seminars and dispatching trade delegations are the next steps to expand economic relations.

Biden North Korea Review Expected Soon: US Official

The Biden administration's review of its policy towards North Korea is expected to be completed "within the next month or so," a senior official of the administration said on Tuesday while declining to say what direction it might take.

The new administration, which took office in January, announced the review following former US president Donald Trump's unprecedented engagement with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, which failed to persuade Pyongyang to give up its nuclear weapons.

"We are involved and engaged in a highly intense strategic review. Our expectations are that it will be done in within the next month or so," the official said.

Biden's Secretary of State Antony Blinken has said the approach to North Korea could involve more sanctions or unspecified diplomatic incentives.

The senior administration official said the US officials involved in the review had been engaged with diplomacy in one manner or other since the mid-1990s.

"Our expectations are probably very much shaped by previous experiences," he said, while noting "some interesting dynamics about the previous, the most immediate, period." "I think we want to explore a variety of different things," he said without elaborating on the content.

The official said North Korea would be among the topics discussed at a first summit of the Quad group of nations - the United States, Japan, India and Australia on Friday. It will also be a topic when Blinken and US Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin visit Japan and South Korea later this month.

The Pentagon expressed concern last week about a UN report indicating possible preprocessing of nuclear fuel for bombs by North Korea, and said such activity could raise tensions with Pyongyang.

Iran Urges US Not to Delay Complying with Law

President of Iran Hassan Rouhani urged that the US administration should not procrastinate when it comes to obedience to international law.

Speaking at a cabinet session on Wednesday, Rouhani reiterated that Iran will resume honoring the JCPOA immediately after the US returns to the nuclear deal by fulfilling all of its commitments.

The Iranian president also advised his American counterpart not to shy away from returning to law and not to hesitate about implementing international regulations.

The continuation of sanctions against Iran is what the Zionists and the regional reactionary regimes are looking for, he said. The president also stressed that the masterminds of plots against Iran have conceded defeat and acknowledge that their policies have backfired. "It means the Iranian nation's victory." US President Joe Biden, one of whose campaign pledges was the US' return to the 2015 Iran nuclear deal, has refused to lift the anti-Iranian sanctions imposed by his predecessor and has even set conditions for rejoining the deal that Donald Trump scrapped in 2018.

Leader's decree on religious prohibition of A-bomb, Iran's resolute stand: Salehi

Head of Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Ali Akbar Salehi said in an interview with America's PBS network that the Supreme Leader of Islamic Revolution's decree on the religious prohibition of atomic bombs is Iran's resolute stand.



Salehi in the interview with the American TV, responded to questions in numerous fields, including world

powers' access to nuclear bombs, restraint power of atomic weapons, Israel's nuclear warheads, possible proponents of atomic bombs among Iranian officials, excerpts of which are presented hereunder.

He also elaborated on various Iranian officials' often-repeated claim that Iran's nuclear program is only for peaceful purposes and the fact that it is haram to manufacture atomic bombs for Iran according to a religious decree issued by the Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution.

The IAEA chief stressed: The final word was said by the Supreme Leader Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei, who issued a religious decree that is irrevocable on being haram of manufacturing the nuclear bombs, so there is no room for more talks on the matter.

"Everyone can talk about their thoughts, mentalities, and desires, but in practice, we need to act in accordance with what the religious decree says," added Salehi.

Asked if there are people in the Iranian political system who might consider the atomic bombs an appropriate option, the IAEA chief



said, "I do not know, there might be some people who think so."

The PBS reporter asked how come the atomic bombs are religiously forbidden, but the long-range missiles are not haram?

"The long-range ballistic missiles target certain subjects that are intended to be demolished, but the atomic bombs, like those used in Hiroshima and Nagasaki, had 200,000 casualties within only the first second after hitting the ground, turning them into powder, and have still effects on next generations," he responded.

Return is required for the side that exits

The Iranian nuclear chief referred to the unilateral US exit from the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) and Iran's remaining in its framework, asking: Why should we complicate the matter? The side whose exit from the JCPOA is recorded must return to it, not any of the existing members.

Salehi emphasized that the hue and cry about the Iranian nuclear issue are artificial and fabricated

to achieve political objectives, reiterating, "The issue was a purely technical matter, turned into political chaos. That is the reason why we have been urged to use political means to resolve it."

On limitations imposed by Iran against the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) inspectors, Salehi said: We did not impose any limitations against the IAEA inspectors. What we did was abandoning only a part of our voluntary acts, which were within the nuclear-Non Proliferation Treaty (NPT) Additional Protocol.

"The cameras of the IAEA are all still functioning and recording whatever they want, but the agency is not capable of having access to their data for three months. Yet, if every side will start acting in accordance with their JCPOA commitments, the cameras will broadcast data to the IAEA live," he added.

On transparency of the Iranian nuclear program, and demolishing of the IAEA cameras' data if all other IAEA sides will not return to their JCPOA

commitments within three months, Salehi said: Solving this problem is quite easy. They should before that date return to observation of their JCPOA commitments and not let that happen.

***The assassination of martyr Fakhrizadeh The PBS reporter asked if martyr Mohsen Fakhrizadeh's assassination was due to the weakness of the Iranian security apparatus.

"That was not a very complicated plot. If you intend to launch a terrorist attack against an individual all you have to do is to hire a terrorist or a number of them to do so," said Salehi, adding that there is no doubt that Israel was involved in that terrorist assassination, in collaboration with the United States.

Are you worried about your own security?

"I'm not worried about that, because I believe life and death are issues within God's Will, and furthermore, we will all die, sooner or later, therefore, if we are martyred so much the better.

US Should Lift All Sanctions at Once: Iranian Official

Secretary of Iran's Expediency Council Mohsen Rezaei dismissed the idea of a staged removal of the US sanctions, stressing that all economic sanctions must be lifted all at once before any further negotiations.

In comments on Tuesday, Rezaei said the only acceptable plan for the termination of the US sanctions on Iran is the framework outlined by Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyed Ali Khamenei. "All sanctions must be lifted together. A staged removal of sanctions is lengthy and unreliable," he noted, saying trust would not be rebuilt with a simple "candy".

Denouncing the violation of the JCPOA by the US and Europe, Rezaei said, "All economic sanctions must be lifted at once, and negotiations will be meaningful after verifying and making sure about the American and European commitment."

In remarks in February, Ayatollah Khamenei said Iran will resume honoring the JCPOA in full only after the US has removed all sanctions on Tehran in a practical and verifiable manner.

Iran, Georgia confer on consular affairs, social interaction

Iran's ambassador to Tbilisi Akbar Ghasemi and the Georgian Foreign Ministry's Consular affairs Director-General Giorgi Tabatadze reviewed the latest developments on consular affairs and social interactions between the two countries.

According to the Embassy of Iran in Tbilisi, the two sides in the meeting exchanged opinions on social interactions and consular affairs.

Ghasemi pointed to the role of human and social interactions in the development of relations between the two countries and said that human interaction has always been acting an important role in the expansion of relations between the two countries.

The Iranian Ambassador expressed hope that the exchange of views and regular meetings of the consular affairs committee, which are held annually between Iran and Georgia, act to facilitate the current processes of trade and economic interactions within the framework of cultural cooperation between the two countries.

Giorgi Tabatadze, for his part, pointed to the importance of Georgia's relations with the Islamic Republic of Iran and outlining the status of relations between the two countries in light of the recent visit of Iran's Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif to Georgia expressed hoped new steps to expand the ties between the two countries.

No negotiations to take place until sanctions lifted

A member of the Iranian Parliament's National Security and Foreign Policy Commission said that no negotiations will take place with the US until the sanctions are lifted.

Lifting of sanctions is the strategy of the Islamic Republic of Iran in response to US violation of JCPOA, said Fada Hussein Maleki, a member of Iranian Parliament's National Security and Foreign Policy Commission in an interview with Mehr News Agency. If the Americans want to return to the table of JCPOA and the Europeans want to soften the international atmosphere, the only way is to lift all US sanctions, he added.

Answering a question over the possibility of renegotiating the JCPOA, with the US, the Iranian Lawmaker said, "No negotiations will take place until the sanctions are lifted."

JCPOA is enforceable if the Americans live up to their commitments under the deal, he stressed.

The US under ex-president Donald Trump pulled out of the agreement in 2018 and imposed the "toughest ever" sanctions on Iran as part of his so-called "maximum pressure," which tried in vain to force Iran back to the negotiating table for talks on a "better deal." Despite throwing verbal support behind the JCPOA, the European parties to the deal — France, Britain, and Germany — ultimately succumbed to Washington's pressure and failed to fulfill their contractual commitments to Tehran, mainly by confronting the American sanctions.

UN Security Council Wrestles with Threat of Action over Myanmar Coup

The UN Security Council failed to agree on Tuesday on a statement that would have condemned the coup in Myanmar, called for restraint by the military and threatened to consider "further measures," though diplomats said talks would likely continue.

During an initial bid to finalize the text, China, Russia, India and Vietnam all suggested amendments late on Tuesday to a British draft, diplomats said, including removal of the reference to a coup and the threat to consider further action.

Such statements by the 15-member body are agreed by consensus. Myanmar has been in crisis since the army ousted leader Aung San Suu Kyi's elected government in a Feb. 1 coup, detained her and officials of her National League for Democracy party and set up a ruling junta of generals.

The military complained of fraud in a November election. The election commission said the vote was fair.

The Security Council issued a statement to the press last month voicing concern over the state of emergency imposed by the

Myanmar military and calling for the release of all those detained, but stopped short of condemning the coup due to opposition from Russia and China.

"Every member state has a role to play individually and collectively. Collectively, we are always looking for a strong voice and strong action from the Security Council," UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric told reporters earlier on Tuesday.

More than 60 people have been killed and some 1,800 people detained in a crackdown on daily protests against the coup around the Southeast Asian nation, an advocacy group has said. Dozens of journalists are among those arrested.

The draft Security Council statement, seen by Reuters on Tuesday, called "on the military to exercise utmost restraint, emphasizes that it is following the situation closely, and states its readiness to consider possible further measures."

An independent UN human rights investigator on Myanmar and New York-based Human Rights Watch have called on the Security Council to impose a global arms embargo and targeted economic sanctions on the junta.

But in an effort to preserve council unity on Myanmar, diplomats



said sanctions were unlikely to be considered any time soon as such measures would probably be opposed by China and Russia, who - along with the United States, France and Britain - are council veto powers. The draft statement, which the council began discussing after a closed briefing on Friday on the situation, strongly condemned "the use of violence against peaceful protesters."

The respiratory tract infection

The respiratory tract infection is an infection that attacks the human respiratory tract. This infection is caused by bacteria or viruses. Based on its location, respiratory tract infections are divided into two types, namely upper and lower respiratory tract infections.

Lower respiratory tract infections trigger cough as the main symptom, while infection of the upper respiratory tract is more complex, such as sneezing, headache, and sore throat. Pain in the body will follow, if the people with has a high fever. The following symptoms of respiratory tract infections in general:

- Cough with phlegm.
- Sneezing.
- Nasal congestion or watery.
- Sore throat.
- Headaches.
- Muscle pain.
- Shortness of breath, or wheezing.
- High fever.
- Unwell.

Respiratory Tract Infection Treatment

The treatment for respiratory tract infections depends on the causes and symptoms experienced. Some of the treatments commonly recommended by doctors are:

Heat-lowering and pain relievers

Heat-lowering and painkillers, which are given to address the complaints of fever, headache, or aches on the body. Most cases of upper respiratory tract infections can be treated alone at home. For example, with pain medications that can be purchased freely, such as ibuprofen or paracetamol, or simply by increasing the rest and fluid intake. This treatment aims to reduce the symptoms of a mild upper respiratory tract infection. Usually the upper respiratory tract infection will heal within 1-2 weeks.

Cough-relief drugs

Cough-relief drugs, to overcome cough complaints. However, it should be discussed further with the doctor because the selection of the drug depends on the type of cough experienced.

The cold medication

The cold medication, which can be administered orally (taken), or through a nasal spray.

Herbal supplement

Some herbal supplements and medicines can be used as alternative remedies, but it is advisable to consult a doctor first. You are also not encouraged to try other treatment methods without the doctor's knowledge and permission.

Antibiotics

If the infection is caused by bacteria, the doctor may also prescribe antibiotics for consumption.

Lower respiratory tract infections, such as pneumonia, can mostly be treated as an outpatient or through antibiotic treatment. Similarly, with patients with bronchitis due to viral infections, it is still possible to get treatment at home. The antibiotic used will be adjusted to the patient's physical condition and response. One of the children-friendly antibiotics is amoxicillin.

How can respiratory infections be prevented?

It is not possible to prevent respiratory infections completely. You may, however, minimize the risk of infection and the risk of a serious course of such an infection.

Everyday hygiene plays an important role in this respect, such as

- washing your hands on a regular basis
- trying not to touch your face, especially in public
- regularly cleaning objects, which are often touched in the workplace and at home (such as door handles, keyboards, phones, remote controls...)

Great significance of full implementation of JCPOA surveyed in London

A number of former diplomats and renowned analysts on Tuesday in a virtual panel discussion at the Royal United Services Institute (RUSI) think-tank exchanged ideas on the great significance of putting the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) back on the rail.

According to the IRNA correspondent in London, in the virtual event sponsored by Forum Qatar sub-institute of RUSI, former British diplomat Peter West Mccourt, a RUSI senior researcher, Ensieh Bashiri-Tabrizi, and an Iranian senior diplomat Seyyed Kazem Sajjadpur presented their viewpoints.

Seyyed Kamal Sajjadpur, the first speaker in the event, focused on the defeat of the US maximum pressure policy, which was later approved also by Peter Maccourt.

Mccourt emphasized that America's maximum pressure policy reached the end of a dead-end alley, the other sides of the JCPOA are now experiencing new conditions, and coming to power of the new US administration has provided new opportunities.

The former British diplomat said that the issue is not as simple as an exit and a re-entry, since the exit was by the former US president and this entry must take place by the ruling president.

"Iran has its reasons for waiting for the Americans to return to the nuclear deal, and if the JCPOA is collapsing, it is the others' responsibility to rush to its rescue," he said. Maccourt who was once an ambassador said that the Americans say they are ready to begin a dialogue, arguing that the other issues, too, are in need of discussion. He said that Iran can as a sign of its goodwill, control its allied forces in Iraq and Syria, and respond positively to the US favorable decision in Yemen.

Ensiyeh Tabrizi focused on the EU stand, saying that the Europeans' strategy, including that of the EU-3, France, Britain and Germany, has been multi-faceted.

According to her, the Europeans believed that the JCPOA needs to be preserved before Biden took charge and at least intended to act according to their commitments, although they failed. But when Biden entered the White House their stands have been managed to tolerate the policies are multi-faceted, inclined towards the inclusion of new issues in a new JCPOA.

The speaker also focused on the newly established relations between some Arab countries in the Persian Gulf region and the Zionist regime of Israel, reiterating, "Although their relations have now improved, talking about the reality of their ties is not so simple. Also, about the Iranian nuclear program, they might have a shared stand, but their viewpoints within the Arab countries' societies on type of relations with Iran differ greatly."

Sajjadpur, the next speaker at the discussion, said that Iran has managed to govern the US sanctions and even achieve a degree of economic growth. According to him the self-confidence of the Iranian decision-makers is high because they say we have managed to tolerate the worst US president's antagonist policies.

The Iranian diplomat said that still there is no justification for the sanctions, since the Americans' behavior was illegal, inhumane, and in addition, based on a brutal assumption: imposing pressure against the Iranian nation will urge them to eventually riot against their own political system.

"Let us not forget that the US maximum pressure policy has faced defeat now," he added.

The analyst reiterated that the US return to JCPOA is not related to other issues, since the JCPOA is an international agreement that is confirmed by the UN Security Council whose implementation is obligatory, and therefore, demanding inclusion of new issues and exit from JCPOA based on that excuse is both illegal and illogical.
