شهرداری اصفهان ادامه داد: رانندگانی در بدنه حمل و نقل سرویس مدارس دارای بیمه تأمین اجتماعی هستند یا علاقمند به سرویس دهی در بخش خصوصی هستند و باید از مجوز طرح زوج و فرد بهره ببرند، در

هادی منوچهری در گفت‌وگو با خبرنگار اخبار اصفهان، اظهار کرد: وجود ویروس کرونا و مطمئن نبودن از بازگشایی مدارس، رانندگان را در تصمیم‌گیری برای تمدید کارت شهری یا تشکیل پرونده مردد کرده است اما نمی‌توان تصمیم‌گیری را به روزهای پایانی شهریور موکول کرد. وی افزود: مطابق روال هر سال، از ابتدای تیرماه توسط شرکت‌های حمل و نقل دانش آموزی ثبت نام ۸۵۰۰ راننده برای سرویس مدارس حدود ۷۵ هزار دانش آموز آغاز می‌شود.

Crude oil accounted for biggest share of Iranian exports to China

The value of trade between Iran and China reached \$5.5 billion in the first five months of 2021, registering a 14-percent decline compared to the figure for the previous year's same period.

According to the data released by the Chinese customs administration, the trade between the two countries stood at 6.4 billion in the first five months of 2020. Iranian exports to China reached \$2.5 billion in the said period, seven percent less than the figure for the same time span in 2020. Iran had exported \$2.7 billion of commodities to China in January-May 2020. Crude oil accounted for the biggest share of Iranian exports to China in 2020, according to the customs data. The imports from the Asian country stood at \$3 billion in the mentioned five months, 19 percent less than the \$3.7-billion in the previous year's same five months. Iran's trade balance with China was \$500 million negative in the said five months. The value of Iran-China non-oil trade stood at \$18.715 billion in the past Iranian calendar year (ended on March 20), according to the spokesman of the Islamic Republic of Iran Customs Administration (IRICA). Ruhollah Latifi put the weight of bilateral trade at 30.128 million tons and said that China was Iran's first non-oil trade partner in the past year. Iran's export to China was 26.585 million tons worth \$8.954 billion, and its imports from that country were 3.543 million tons valued at \$9.761 billion in the previous year, the official announced. Pistachios, nuts and spices, mineral and industrial raw materials, construction materials, methanol, polyethylene, carpets, glassware, iron ingots, iron products, dates, grapes, and fruits, along with petroleum products were Iran's main exported items to China, Latifi stated.

He mentioned machinery and industrial raw materials, medical equipment, cereals, yeasts, paper, wood and boards, fabrics and yarns, auto parts, all kinds of wires, sports equipment, data processing machines, glasses, and all kinds of yeasts and seeds as Iran's major imported items from China.

Iran and China officially signed a document for 25-year comprehensive cooperation in late March.

Gas Shortage Pushes Coal Prices to Ten-Year High

Tight natural gas supply and a rebound in electricity consumption have combined to push thermal coal prices to the highest in a decade and insufficient rainfall in China has contributed to the trend. The price of export coal from Newcastle, Australia — most of which goes to Asia — has gained 56% over the last year. European prices have also risen, adding 64% since the start of the year, Oil Price reported. Coal supply is also experiencing a growing tightness because of low investment in new production, partially the result of a drive toward lower use of the dirtiest fossil fuel and a boost in renewable electricity generation capacity. However, the latest price trends suggest that this capacity still falls short of meeting the demand for electricity in most key markets. Coal prices are likely to remain higher over the next few months due to the situation with fundamentals. "Supply is shrinking and it's probably shrinking faster than demand," Tom Price, the head of commodities strategy at Liberum, said. "Everyone had turned their backs on these [thermal-coal mining] assets. Those companies that have clung on to them have made a small fortune on them in just the past few months."

Special attention to neighboring states first step to develop tourism

Some prominent university professors have urged the upcoming administration in Iran to attach great importance to the tourism industry in particular attracting tourists from neighboring countries.



A virtual scientific seminar was held on Monday in Tehran to discuss priorities of the administration of President-elect

Ebrahim Raisi in tourism industry with the aim of extending regional cooperation especially in the Persian Gulf region. Participants stressed the need for strengthening of tourism diplomacy in particular when it comes to relationships with neighboring states. Esmail Ghaderi, a professor at Allameh Tabataba'i University, said in the webinar that Iran can attract 15 million tourists from neighboring countries, adding that good management can be more effective in development of tourism industry than

tourism attractions.

Tourism diplomacy can help resolve differences Naser Rezai, a member of the Research Institute of Cultural Heritage and Tourism (RICHT), said that tourism diplomacy along with official diplomacy can be one of the main tools to resolve differences among states. According to the academic, tourism has never been a priority of the Iranian administrations; and despite the fact that the outgoing administration tried to pay more attention to the industry,

tourism is not yet in its best position.

JCPOA faded Iranophobia Saman Khalilian, another professor, said that the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) has helped declining Iranophobia; thus, the number of foreign tourists traveling to increased 2.7 percent before the outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic. Tourism consolidates security, stability Another academic, Ali Rahimpour, emphasized that tourism industry is not limited to a particular border and it can enhance

security and stability around the globe.

Tourism can promote job creation and help countries to have a sustainable income, he said, adding that protection of natural resources is another advantage of the industry. He further noted that change of political approach, de-escalation, joint venture with neighboring countries and confidence-building with other governments are among the best ways to pave the ground for boosting tourism.

Housing price in Tehran city rises 3% in a month

Average housing price rose three percent in Tehran City during the past Iranian calendar month of Khordad (ended on June 21), compared to its previous month, according to a report by the Central Bank of Iran (CBI). The housing price in the capital city also experienced a 56.6-percent rise as compared to the same month in the past year. The CBI report put the average price for one square meter of a residential unit at 296 million rials (about \$7,047) in the capital city in the mentioned month. As reported, the number of real estate deals increased 29.6 percent in the past month from its preceding month. The housing market in Tehran was the second-highest returning market in Iran among the country's four major markets in the previous Iranian calendar year (ended

on March 20) with 85 percent annual growth. The information obtained from Kild website (which is a major platform for housing trades) indicated that the housing price index in Tehran grew by 85 percent in the previous Iranian calendar year (ended on March 20) compared to its preceding year. The highest monthly price increase of 12.5 percent occurred in the Iranian calendar month of Mordad (July 22-August 21, 2020), while the biggest monthly price decrease occurred in Azar (November 21-December 20, 2020) with a decline of 8.1 percent. Last month, the head of Iran's Property Advisers Union said housing prices in the country should decrease at least 25 percent in order for people to be able to afford to purchase.

Mostafa Gholi Khosravi noted that the closure of real estate agencies due to the coronavirus pandemic has caused some problems in this market, calling for the re-

opening of the agencies in compliance with health protocols.

The official also stressed the need for establishing a market regulation headquarters for the housing sector to monitor the activities of dealers and real estate agencies in order to balance the prices. Housing prices in Iran have been constantly rising over the past year due to various internal and external factors.

Coronavirus has been reported to be a major factor affecting the housing prices in Iran as the pandemic has stoked concerns about losing one's savings and more people entered the housing market.

"People are turning to the housing market in order to protect their savings in the face of rising inflation. No one sees housing as a short-term consumer commodity. Even real consumers view purchasing a home as a long-term investment," Mehdi Soltan-Mohammadi, a housing expert, said.

'Housing and Utilities' Inflation Surges Past 27 Percent

The average goods and services Consumer Price Index of "housing and utilities" (water, electricity, natural gas and other fuels) in the 12-month period ending June 21, which marks the end of the third Iranian month of the fiscal 2021-22, increased by 27.1% compared with last year's corresponding period.

The CPI of the group stood at 222 for the month under review, indicating a 1.4% rise compared with the month before.

The CPI of "housing and utilities", which has the biggest impact on total inflation rate with 35.5%, registered a year-on-year increase of 28.5%.

Apart from "housing and utilities", the 12 groups of the basket of consumer goods and services purchased by households surveyed by SCI include "food and beverages" with 26.64%, tobacco with 0.59%, "clothing and shoes" with 4.78%, "health and treatment" with 7.14%, "furniture, home appliances and their maintenance" with 3.93%, "communications" with 2.87%, "transportation" with 9.41%, "leisure and culture" with 1.65%, "education" with 1.86%, "hotels and restaurants" with 1.44% and "miscellaneous items and services" with 4.18%.

The overall average goods and services Consumer Price Index in the 12-month period ending June 21 increased by 43% compared with the corresponding period of the year before, latest data released by the Statistical Center of Iran show.

This is for the 10th consecutive month that the annualized inflation has been on the rise.

SCI had put the average annual inflation rate for the preceding Iranian month, which ended on May 21, at 41%.

Iran Reaffirms Support for Syria in War on Terror

Senior adviser to the Iranian foreign minister for special political affairs Ali Asghar Khaji assured Syria that Tehran will continue to assist the Arab country in the fight against terrorism and in the post-war reconstruction process.

Khaji on Monday held a meeting with Syrian President Bashar al-Assad in Damascus, where they discussed ways to promote cooperation between the two countries in various areas.

The Iranian diplomat said the high turnout of the Syrian people in the country's last month presidential election, which led to Assad's landslide victory and winning his fourth seven-year term, conveyed a clear message of their strong will.

Khaji also gave an assurance that Iran will continue to support the Syrian government and people in the battle against terrorism. He reiterated Iran's readiness to play an active role in the reconstruction of Syria and to support its economy in different sectors in a way that eases the burdens of the unjust Western blockade on the Arab country's people.

For his part, Assad congratulated the successful presidential election in Iran earlier this month, which dealt a new blow to all forces that are trying to target the Islamic Republic's security and safety, Press TV reported.

In the meeting, Assad and Khaji also exchanged views about strategic relations between Syria and Iran and underlined the important role played by the two countries' joint committees to enhance cooperation in all areas, particularly in the economic sector to serve common interests of the two nations.

Iran's chemical defense power should be improved

Head of Iran's Passive Defense Organization Brigadier General Gholamreza Jalali called for affiliated Iranian organizations to do their best for improving the country's chemical defense power. He made the remarks addressing the Fourth National Conference on Chemical Defense held simultaneous with the chemical attack on Sardasht and Halabja.

"If those involved in the chemical bombing of Sardasht and Halabja had been sentenced in courts, we would have not been witnessing the use of chemical weapons by countries today," he said.

He added that although human rights and respect for human life are discussed across the world, chemical weapons are unfortunately used to secure the interests of the arrogant power. "This proves that the international conventions have no deterrent power," Jalali underscored.

He criticized the westerners for their support for use of chemical weapons across the globe, despite the slogans for the protection of human rights. "It is very important to produce equipment that protects us against chemical threats, and we need to have strong industries in this field," he said.

Putin Signs Bill on Raising Age of Purchasing Hunting Weapons to 21

Russian President Vladimir Putin signed a bill increasing the minimum age of purchasing hunting weapons and long barreled guns for self-defense purposes from 18 to 21 and also introducing new grounds for refusing to issue licenses. The document was published on the official legal information portal on Monday, TASS reported. The age increase won't concern individuals, who served or are serving in the army, members of state military organizations, having military ranks or special ranks or judiciary class ranks. In the previous version of the law, the minimum purchasing age of 21 only concerned civil firearms. However, indigenous small-numbered peoples, professional hunters and staff of private security firms and other legal entities with special tasks will preserve the right to buy hunting weapons since the age of 18. Besides, individuals above 18 will be able to purchase smooth-bore barrels or long-barreled hunting weapons for doing sports. The bill also imposes additional grounds for refusing to issue licenses for buying weapons. Earlier, the list of such reasons included outstanding convictions for premeditated crimes or grave crimes with the use of weapons.

Some fundamental disputes remained in Vienna talks: Blinken

In his recent remarks on the state of negotiations in Vienna to revive the JCPOA, the US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said that there are still some fundamental disputes.



According to Al-Jazeera, the US Secretary of State in new remarks on Tuesday on the status of the Vienna talks to

revive the Iran nuclear deal (JCPOA) said that indirect US talks with Iran in Vienna have removed some obstacles [to revive the JCPOA], but there are still some fundamental disputes.

Without mentioning that the US was a party that violated its obligations in the JCPOA, Antony Blinken claimed that now the ball is in Iran's court.

According to Anthony Blinken, it is up to Iran to decide whether it is ready to return to its obligations



under the JCPOA.

Earlier, the Iranian Foreign Ministry Spokesman said that Iran has never left the JCPOA and it is the United States that must make its decision to return to it.

"The Islamic Republic of Iran has never left the JCPOA, it is the United States that must make its decision and return to the deal by lifting illegal sanctions and effectively fulfilling its final

commitments," said Saeed Khatibzadeh regarding the remarks made by the US and French foreign ministers that they are waiting for Iran's decision to return to the JCPOA.

"The United States and the Europeans know best that there have been enough rounds of Vienna talks so far, urging the JCPOA parties for making their tough decisions to

revitalize the deal. on the Iranian people, and Europe's inaction, it kept the JCPOA alive and remained in the deal," he added.

Meanwhile, the head of Iran's negotiating team in Vienna talks on reviving the JCPOA Abbas Araghchi said that there have been enough rounds of Vienna talks so far, urging the JCPOA parties for making their tough decisions to

Next Iranian Admin May Take Over JCPOA Talks: Spokesman

The administration of Iranian President-elect Ebrahim Raeisi will handle the negotiations on the revival of the 2015 nuclear deal if Tehran's desirable demands are not met until the end of the outgoing administration's term, the spokesman for the government said.

In comments at a weekly press conference on Tuesday, Ali Rabiee said Iran has made clear its stances in the Vienna talks on the revival of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, adding that the negotiations have reached a point where all parties should make their decisions. "We have made and declared our decisions and are waiting for the other sides, including the United States of America, to announce their political decisions so that we could

discuss more clearly according to them in the next round of the negotiations."

The spokesman also said that if Iran's demands are not met until the end of tenure of President Hassan Rouhani, the next administration will take over the case at the discretion of the top decision-makers in the Iranian establishment.

"If our views are fulfilled, there won't be even a moment of delay (in concluding an agreement), but if the demands are not met, the continuation of negotiations will be deferred to the next administration," Rabiee said.

He further explained that agreements have been reached on the removal of sanctions on the main sectors of Iran's economy, such as the energy, banking and insurance sectors.

However, the spokesman said, the failure to achieve a consensus on all of the topics

on the agenda of the talks will mean that no agreement has been shaped in practice.

Last week, Rouhani said the main issues in the Vienna talks have been settled and that it was possible to have the sanctions lifted right away.

He noted that the next administration will have a much easier job in running the country, since his administration has handled the situation under an unprecedented economic war and while facing the problems in the import of medicine and foodstuff.

Ebrahim Raeisi, the incumbent Judiciary Chief of Iran, has won the June 18 presidential election by a landslide.

In his first press conference after winning the election, Raeisi took a swipe at the US for violating the JCPOA and at the European states for failing to honor their commitments under the nuclear deal.



Biden reiterates anti-Iranian claims in meeting with Rivlin

The US president reiterated his anti-Iranian claims during a meeting with the head of the Israeli regime in Washington.

According to the report, Joe Biden told Reuven Rivlin that as long as he is the President, Iran will never acquire a nuclear weapon.

These claims come while Tehran has repeatedly announced that it has no intention to build nuclear weapons as it has been banned by a religious Fatwa of the Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Khamenei.

The US President also noted that Washington is committed to maintaining the security of the Israeli regime, adding that he was looking forward to meeting with the new prime minister, Naftali Bennett.

Reuven Rivlin expressed satisfaction with Biden's remarks against Iran, saying that Israel has no greater friend than the United States.

Elsewhere in his remarks during the meeting, Biden referred to the US attack on Monday morning on the PMU positions on the Iraqi-Syrian border and said that he personally ordered the recent attacks on positions of PMU in Iraq and Syria.

Iraqi presidency condemns US airstrikes on PMU positions

In a statement, the Iraqi presidency condemned the US attack on positions of Iraq's Popular Mobilization Unit (PMU), calling it a violation of Iraqi sovereignty and national security.

The Iraqi presidency stressed in a statement that Iraq condemns the targeting of a base on the Iraqi-Syrian border.

The statement called the attack a violation of Iraq's sovereignty and national security, saying that this attack undermines national efforts to achieve security and stability in the country.

Through diplomatic efforts, Iraq strongly supports dialogue and contacts with various parties to ensure the security, stability and sovereignty of the country, the statement read.

On Monday, the US Department of Defense announced that US warplanes had launched airstrikes on positions in the Al Bukamal region on the Iraqi-Syrian border. The aerial attacks by the US warplanes have sparked widespread condemnation on the part of Iraqi resistance forces, the Armed forces of Iraq as well as political figures. The new round of US attacks on Popular Mobilization Units (PMU) or Hashd Shabi came as political parties and groups continue to demand the withdrawal of Americans from Iraqi soil.

Iran UN Envoy Raps Israel as Biggest Violator of Child Rights

Iran's ambassador to the UN denounced the Zionist regime for committing the most systematic and gross violations of the rights of children in the Middle East, describing the barbaric Israeli acts as clear manifestations of genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity. Addressing a UN Security Council meeting on "Children and Armed Conflict", held in New York on Monday, Majid Takht Ravanchi called for the punishment of the Israeli officials for the fundamental breach of norms and principles of international law. The following is the full text of the Iranian ambassador's speech: "Protection of children, particularly girls, in armed conflicts is a fundamental moral and humanitarian principle and every effort must be made to ensure that it is fully respected by all parties in all conflicts. Nevertheless, it is highly alarming that according to annual report of the Secretary-General on children and armed conflict, "In 2020, the situation of children in armed conflict was marked by a sustained high number of grave violations." Unfortunately, many of such violations have occurred in our neighborhood from Afghanistan to Yemen to Palestine. The most recent example of such violations in Afghanistan is a cowardly terrorist attack that took place, on 8 May 2021, in front of the Sayed Al-Shuhada school in the community of Shi'ites of the Hazara minority in Kabul, killing 85 and injuring 147 others, mostly

schoolgirls.

This and other deadly terrorist acts in Afghanistan, mostly committed by Daesh, targeting certain religious and ethnic minorities as well as women and girls, underscore the continued need for combating terrorism as well as brining the perpetrators of these reprehensible acts to justice.

In Yemen, in 2020 the United Nations verified the killing and maiming of 194 by the so-called Coalition to Support Legitimacy in Yemen, as stated by the Secretary-General in his annual report. Nonetheless, on 22 June 2021, Yemeni children marched across the country stating that in more than six years, as a result of the attacks by that Coalition, over 3,500 Yemeni children were martyred, more than 4,000 were injured, thousands were orphaned, and millions were displaced from their homes. They also expressed their strong dissatisfaction with the United Nations for not properly reflecting in its reports of such grave violations of the rights of Yemeni children. Yet, the most systematic and gross violation of the rights of child in the Middle East continues to be committed by the Israeli regime. According to the annual report of the Secretary-General, in 2020, the United Nations verified 1,031 cases of grave violations against 340 Palestinian children, including killing 11, maiming 324 and detaining 361, as well as 30 attacks on schools and hospitals by



Israeli forces.

Only in its 11-day brutal and all-out war on Gaza in May 2021, Israeli forces killed 253 Palestinians, including 66 children. This includes 13 members of an extended family who have been killed and buried in the rubble of their own home -- many of whom were children, one as young as six months. Israeli forces also destroyed 30 health facilities and around 50 schools.

These barbaric acts are clear manifestations of genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity, materially breach fundamental norms and principles of international law, and entail international responsibility of the Israeli regime, whose officials must therefore be brought to justice for committing such heinous crimes.

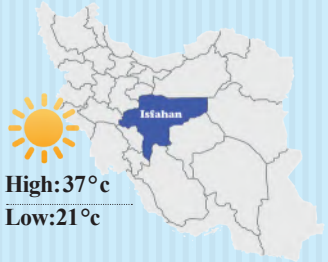

Death Toll Climbs to 11 in Florida Condo Collapse, 150 Missing

Search-and-rescue teams pulled two more bodies from the concrete and steel rubble of a partially collapsed Florida condominium tower on Monday, bringing the death toll to 11 with 150 people still listed as missing four days after the disaster.



Pouring rain and slabs of cement hampered round-the-clock efforts to pick through debris left from the unexplained cave-in of nearly half of the 12-floor, 156-unit building, in what may end up as the deadliest unintentional structural failure in US history.

No survivors have been pulled from the ocean-front ruins of the Champlain Towers South condo in the town of Surfside, near Miami, since the first hours after the building abruptly crumbled into a heap early on Thursday as residents slept.

"We have people waiting and waiting and waiting. That is excruciating," Miami-Dade County Mayor Daniella Levine Cava told an afternoon news briefing on Monday, referring to friends and family members of the missing. "They are coping with the news that they might not have loved ones come out alive and still hoping that they will," the mayor said. "Their loved ones may come out as body parts."

Rescue crews, including experts sent by Israel and Mexico, were using cranes, dogs and infrared scanners to identify signs of life in the ruins, although hope was diminishing as time wore on.

What caused the 40-year-old high-rise to give way remained under investigation, but initial attention focused on structural deficiencies identified in a 2008 engineer's report released by surfside city officials.

The condo association president warned residents in an April 2021 letter that visible concrete deterioration in the parking garage beneath the building had "gotten significantly worse over the years," along with roof damage, and urged them to pay some \$15 million in assessments needed make repairs, The Wall Street Journal and USA Today each reported on Monday.

The letter's author, Jean Wodnicki, survived

Thursday's collapse, the newspapers said.

As darkness fell over the site on Monday, more than 100 people gathered somberly, some holding candles, a short distance from where one crane stood illuminated against the night sky. A woman led the group in a meditation, and someone sounded a gong. Behind them, in enormous letters, the word "HOPE" had been inscribed in the sand.

Some relatives of the missing have provided DNA samples to officials for use in positively identifying remains. Family members were permitted to visit the site on Sunday.

Miami-Dade Assistant Fire Chief Raide Jadallah said workers have found voids large enough to keep victims alive.

"Not to say that we have seen anyone down there, but we've not gotten to the very bottom," he said.

Jadallah said searchers have heard some sounds, such as tapping or scratching that could possibly be made by a survivor, though he acknowledged they could also be caused by shifting metal.

The 2018 engineer's report found severe concrete erosion in the underground parking garage and major damage in a slab beneath the pool deck. The report's author, Frank Morabito, wrote that the deterioration would "expand exponentially" if not repaired.

Ross Prieto, then Surf side's top building official, met residents the following month after reviewing the report and assured them the building was "in very good shape," according to minutes of the meeting released on Monday. After the meeting, Prieto emailed the town's manager to say it "went very well ... All main concerns over their forty year recertification process were addressed."

Fourth Major Australian City Ordered into Virus Lockdown

Brisbane on Tuesday became the fourth major Australian city ordered into lockdown, as officials told residents to stay at home for three days over concerns about the rapid spread of COVID-19.

About 10 million Australians will be in lockdown once the latest order comes into force from Tuesday evening.

"These are tough decisions," Queensland state Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk said. "We are having lockdowns in major cities because the overseas arrivals are bringing the virus here."

Residents of Perth in Australia's west woke to a four-day snap lockdown Tuesday morning, joining Sydney and Darwin residents, with the rules applying from midnight Monday into Tuesday and lasting a minimum of four days.

Just three positive cases have been diagnosed in Perth since the outbreak was detected but local health officials have long taken a highly cautious approach to any coronavirus clusters.

"We know the risk COVID presents and we know from around the world that the Delta strain is another new beast that we can't take any chances with," Western Australia state Premier Mark McGowan said in a late-night press conference Monday, AFP reported.

Australia has been broadly successful in containing virus clusters, but is now battling flare-ups of the highly contagious Delta variant, which first emerged in India, across the vast continent nation.

Under pressure over his government's response, Prime Minister Scott Morrison

announced vaccines will become mandatory for aged care and quarantine hotel workers, while the AstraZeneca jab will be available to people aged under 60 who sign an indemnity form.

The conservative government has been criticized over a sluggish vaccine rollout and failing to improve the leaky hotel quarantine system, while refusing to release data on how many Australians have been fully vaccinated. Almost 7.4 million vaccine doses have been administered to date, with less than five percent of adults reported to have received both jabs. Morrison acknowledged growing frustrations but placed the blame on disruptions caused to Australians' lives by the pandemic.

"We've got to hang in there. We don't have a choice. The pandemic is still upon us," he said late Monday.

Australia has recorded a total of just over 30,000 cases and 910 deaths in a population of about 25 million since the pandemic began.

The largest current outbreak is in Sydney, where 130 people have tested positive for COVID-19 since a driver for an international flight crew was diagnosed in mid-June, with the city's residents now under stay-at-home orders for two weeks.

A small cluster linked to an outback gold mine sent Darwin into lockdown after exposure sites were found for the first time in the city, which is home to a large Indigenous population feared to be more vulnerable to COVID-19.

In all locked-down areas, people are generally required to stay at home except for essential work, exercise, to buy groceries or for medical reasons.

US base in Syria comes under rocket attack

The US military has confirmed a rocket attack against one of its illegal bases in Syria.

The rocket attack took place in the eastern Syrian province of Dayr al-Zawr on Monday, Reuters reported citing "sources" in the province. The report named the exact whereabouts of the incident as the proximity of

Syria's Omar oilfield, which is controlled by the US-backed Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) militant group. The attack came less than 24 hours after airstrikes ordered by US President Joe Biden target facilities reportedly belonging to Iraqi resistance groups on both sides of Iraq and Syria's common border. "At 7:44 P local time, US Forces in Syria were attacked by multiple rockets.

There are no injuries and damage is being assessed," Coly. Wayne Morrotto, spokesman for Operation Inherent Resolve, meanwhile, said, PressTV reported. The operation is the codename for a US-led offensive targeting Iraq and Syria since 2014 under the pretext of fighting the Takfiri terrorist group of Daesh. The Iraqi parliament and Damascus have both ruled the operation as illegal.
